2012-2013 Club Goals


- 1. Attain & Maintain 52 total members.

Susan Epps, Executive Director of the local chapter of the American Red Cross gave an overview of operations in our area. This included:


• 96% of all the work is done by volunteers. This includes the operation of the 70 potential shelters that can be activated in case of an emergency.

- Support the "first responders" [police and fire] with emergency calls in Lincoln.
- With the help of the Lincoln Fire Department, they provide basic first aid training to all 4th graders.
- The provide First Aid teams [250 volunteers] to over 300 community events each year. This is the largest first aid team in the nation, and began in 1937 by continually providing support to every home Husker football game since that time. In appreciation, the University allows the "passing of the bucket" at sporting events to support the agency.
- Red Cross also coordinates the Holiday Cards for the Veterans


On Friday November 30th, Joe Roberts formally kicked off the Dr. George J. Lytton Memorial Challenge Lincoln South Rotary Club 2012-2013 Rotary International Foundation Drive. The drive will be held from December 2012 through January 2013. The motto of the drive is "Every Rotarian, Every Year" which means that the goal is to get 100% of our members to contribute \$120 to the RI Foundation. Contributions can be made in lump sum or monthly through the bank draft, or bank card programs. Any Rotarian may designate the funds to polio or annual programs funds.

On Friday January 25th the drive will conclude with a drawing for an immediate Paul Harris Fellow recognition (a \$1,000 value.) Members must have contributed at least \$300 in prior years to be eligible for the drawing.

Lincoln South has historically been one of the most generous clubs in the District, averaging 96% participation with annual contributions totaling \$9,500 or more. The per member average is \$180 or more.

104 Paul Harris Fellows have come out of the Lincoln Rotary South Club and the club has donated in excess of \$160,000 since the inception of the club
