

Corporate Membership Policy

This Corporate Membership recognizes that some companies/organizations would support having more than one employee being a member of Rotary. It also recognizes that others opt for involvement in other available service clubs in the community as well and having multiple members in one club would be less likely. It is noted that diversity in vocations has been a long-standing practice in Rotary and representation from businesses across the community remains important. By the same token, given the size of our community, and our interest in representation and diversity in gender, race, ethnicity, age, income, ability/disability, etc., the opportunity to have more than one member from the same business or industry is advantageous. We can increase our impact, expand our reach, and provide additional individuals with opportunities to be part of a club that fosters service above self with this modest discount for a second or more member from the same organization/business.

Current dues for 2023-24 are \$391.50 per member per year. This includes a \$25.00 contribution to the Council Bluffs Noon Club's Foundation for scholarships. The proposed fee structure for additional member(s) from the same organization/business is as follows:

- This standard \$391.50/year remains the fee for the first member from an organization/business. Any dues increase approved by the board of directors would be the rate for the first corporate member as well.
- \$341.50/year is the proposed fee for each additional member from the same organization/business. If the dues have been increased, this rate will be adjusted accordingly for each additional member.
- The membership(s) must be in the name of the individual(s) versus the organization/business.
- Each individual member (or their organization/business) will also be assessed the Induction fee set by the club which covers the costs for the plaque, pin(s), and badge(s).
- The \$100/year suggested donation to the Rotary Foundation (TRF), annual Polio-Plus contribution and other club contributions remain the responsibility of each individual member. Payment of the TRF contribution is an option on the dues invoice.
- In the event a member that joined the club under a Corporate Membership policy leaves the employ of the organization/business during the Rotary year, the organization/business would be allowed to substitute in a new employee to finish out that Rotary year (June 1-July 31). The induction fee would be charged for each different employee joining the club. The member leaving the employment of the Corporate Member organization/business would then be responsible for their dues on a pro-rated basis for the remainder of the Rotary year and for each year thereafter.
- Each member within a Corporate Membership holds the same membership benefits and responsibilities including but not limited to honoring the purpose, mission, and vision of Rotary International, upholding the Four-Way test, participating in Rotary meetings, serving on a committee, supporting service/volunteer projects, etc. Each member is enrolled in Rotary International via ClubRunner and has access to the many on-line resources, receives the Rotary magazine, and has the opportunity to engage with other Rotarians and Rotary functions worldwide.

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
