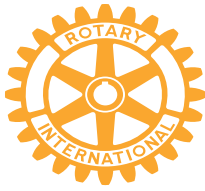
SERVICE

- Vocational Service encourages Rotarians to serve others through their vocations and to practice high ethical standards.
- Community Service covers the projects and activities the Club undertakes to improve life in its community.
- International Service encompasses actions taken to expand Rotary's humanitarian reach around the globe and to promote world understanding and peace.
- Youth Service allows our members to engage with Rotary Youth Exchange Students, Rotary Youth Leadership Awards (RYLA), Interact Clubs (high-school age Rotary Clubs), and Rotaract Clubs (college- age and young professional age Rotary Clubs), as well as any other programs and projects that involve our youth.

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Why Join Rotary?

1. **Friendship:** In an increasingly complex world, Rotary fulfills one of the most basic human needs: the need for friendship and fellowship. It is one of two reasons why Rotary began in 1905.
2. **Business Development:** The second original reason for Rotary's beginning is business development. Everyone needs to network. Rotary consists of a cross section of every business in a community. Its members come from all walks of life. Rotarians help each other and collectively help others.
3. **Personal Growth and Development:** Membership in Rotary continues one's growth and education in human relations and personal development.
4. **Leadership Development:** Rotary is an organization of leaders and successful people. Serving in Rotary positions is like a college education. Leadership: - learning how to motivate, influence, and lead leaders.
5. **The Opportunity to Serve:** Rotary is a service organization. Our business is humanity. Our product is service. Rotarians provide community service to both local and international communities. 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THE FOUR-WAY TEST

From the earliest days of the organization, Rotarians were concerned with promoting high ethical standards in their professional lives. One of the world’s most widely printed and quoted statements of business ethics is The Four-Way Test, which was created in 1932 by Rotarian Herbert J. Taylor (who later served as RI president) when he was asked to take charge of a company that was facing bankruptcy.

This 24-word test for employees to follow in their business and professional lives became the guide for sales, production, advertising, and all relations with dealers and customers, and the survival of the company is credited to this simple philosophy. Adopted by Rotary in 1943, The Four-Way Test has been translated into more than a hundred languages and published in thousands of ways. It asks the following four questions:

The Four-Way Test “Of the things we think, say or do:

1. Is it the TRUTH?
2. Is it FAIR to all concerned?
3. Will it build GOODWILL and BETTER FRIENDSHIPS?
4. Will it be BENEFICIAL to all concerned?”

Rotary Dues: Membership dues are invoiced and paid quarterly with invoices sent to your chosen e-mail or mailing address. Members may request invoices be made out and/or sent directly to their firm or employer. Dues are \$235 annually (can be paid annually or quarterly). The breakdown of dues is as follows:

Rotary International:	\$74.00
Rotary District 6250:	\$40.00
Club:	<u>\$121.00</u>
Total:	\$235.00 (revised annually)

Meal charges include a small fee for room rental of our meeting area plus the meal cost. The total per meal is \$13.50 (revised annually). Members are billed quarterly for the meals they eat.

Initiation Fee: There is an initiation fee of \$75 due with your application. Rotarians moving to our club from a different club (\$35.00)
