Each year at the club's Changing of the Guard, we celebrate a number of club milestones, including our acknowledgement of achievements over the past Rotary year. The club has a tradition of recognizing meritorious work, and this year's Awards Committee recommends four award categories, similar to what was done last year. Awards will be presented at the 2017 Changing of the Guard dinner.

Please consider the service of your fellow Rotarians, an individual or an organization in the framework of the four (4) award categories described below.

1. Paul Harris Fellow:

1.1. For honoring an M-T Sunrise Rotarian, consider the following criteria:

- 1.1.1. The Rotarian exemplifies the Rotary Four-Way Test in his/her professional, business and community life.
- 1.1.2. The Rotarian has provided extensive support and leadership to the Club for a period of years. The Rotarian may have been an officer, but this is not a prerequisite.
- 1.1.3. The Rotarian has a record of community service.
- 1.1.4. The Rotarian has demonstrated "Service Above Self" beyond the normal requirements of club membership.

1.2. For honoring an external, non-M-T Sunrise Rotarian community member, consider these criteria:

- 1.2.1. The person exemplifies the Rotary Four-Way Test in his/her professional, business and community life.
- 1.2.2. The person has a sustained record of community service.
- 1.2.3. The person has demonstrated the "Service Above Self" approach to serving the community beyond the minimal requirements of citizenship.
- 1.2.4. The person is respected and honored as a leader in the community.
- 1.2.5. The person supports Rotarian efforts.

2. Avenues of Service Citation:

2.1. This citation provides a way for Rotary clubs to personally recognize one club member for his/her outstanding efforts in the five avenues of service. A club member must have demonstrated support of the "Object of Rotary" through active participation in each of the five Avenues: Club, Vocational, Community,

International and New Generations. Nominees must be an active Rotarian and can only receive this award once. Selected nominees will be submitted to RI.

3. Mequon – Thiensville Sunrise Rotary – Service Above Self Award:

3.1. This award recognizes Rotarians who have demonstrated exemplary humanitarian service, with an emphasis on personal volunteer efforts and active involvement in helping others through Rotary. A selected nominee may also be submitted to the District Governor in consideration for the RI Service Above Self Award.

4. Family and Community Service Award:

4.1. This award is a certificate that Rotary Clubs may confer on individuals or organizations for outstanding service to the community, or in recognition of the positive contributions to individual Rotary clubs made by spouses or family members of Rotarians.
