Central Bucks Rotary donates \$40,000 from Ride For The Heroes

The Rotary Club of Central Bucks' eighth annual motorcycle Ride For The Heroes roared through Pennsylvania and New Jersey on June 4.

The police-escorted ride began at the Garden of Reflection in Lower Makefield and ended at the Fraternal Order of Police Picnic Grove in Bedminster Township, Pa. The event honors and raises funds to support causes that assist veterans and families of fallen heroes.

The event began with a brief ceremony during which the names of veterans honored through donations to Ride For The Heroes were read. Following the ceremony, the police-escorted caravan of riders headed off on a 65-mile route through parts of Bucks County and Stockton, N.J.

The event continued with a picnic and live music courtesy of the BKWG (Bob Kadel Wears Glasses) Band at the Fraternal Order of Police Picnic Grove in Bedminster Township.

With 470 motorcycles and 638 riders participating this year, Rotary Club of Central Bucks will be able to donate more than \$40,000 to causes that support veterans and families of fallen heroes. Since the inception of Ride For The Heroes, Rotary Club of Central Bucks has donated more than \$250,000 to a variety of causes.
