GUEST SPEAKER:

Today's guest speaker was Lesley McCarthy. Lesley is member of the Rotary Club of Flemington Kensington and has held all roles in her club including four years as President. She has also been an Assistant Governor and was editor of the district newsletter for 8 years. Lesley is a Paul Harris Fellow + 8 signified by three rubies on her PHF badge which you don't see very often, and she is also a Royce Abbey Awardee.

Lesley has worked at district level as a Rotary Leadership Institute facilitator and as a member of the District environment team. She is also an ESRAG Oceania executive.

Lesley provided details of the Regionalisation Pilot. It is a Rotary International project looking to address membership, public image, communication, leadership, and fundraising challenges globally. The aim is to help define a more sustainable future for Rotary.

Our region, Zone 8, which includes Australia, New Zealand, and the Pacific Islands, has been selected as one of two zones to pilot a regional approach to governance. The other zone encompasses Great Britain and Northern Ireland. It is important that all Rotarians are consulted throughout this process. In fact, the project cannot proceed without the support of members and clubs.

The overarching aim of this project is to provide better and more direct support to Rotary and Rotaract clubs through a less layered and more devolved contemporary approach. All clubs will be asked to vote on the pilot in September.
