- impact;
- communication; and
- technical merit.

David then proceeded to announce fourteen prizes, including Best in Show awarded to Phil Suter for the piece entitled *Mill of Mystery*, shown below.

Nola Spicer then officially opened the 2023 Moonee Valley Art Show, announcing the winner of the Art Show Committee's Choice prize as Janet Doyle for her piece *Stevenson's Falls Ferns*.

The Art Show catalogue listed three hundred and fifty four paintings available for viewing and purchase with an average price of \$887. Prices ranged from \$60 to \$8950. Nine pieces were sold during the Gala evening and a further ten on Saturday May 20. Ten more were sold on Sunday May 21 and on o line on Monday May 22. A quick calculation shows that these 30 pieces collectively have generated almost \$21,000 in gross revenue.


