Peter then introduced his long-time friend, neighbour and tonight's guest speaker, <u>Bill Anderson</u>. Peter and Bill were scout leaders together, an activity which followed Bill's return from Vietnam.


After his number came up in the conscription ballot, Bill completed

training under the National Service Scheme and



sailed to Vung Tau aboard HMAS Sydney. Bill was a member of 7 Battalion, Royal Australian Regiment (7 RAR) based at Nui Dat in Phuoc Tuy Province, south east of Ho Chi Minh City (then Saigon).

Bill was a radio operator, a function he performed in company headquarters and on active patrols. Australian camps allowed the consumption of alcohol, although soldiers were rationed – 2 cans per day, per man, perhaps! The ration was cumulative and many extended parties were held after lengthy patrols. His tour encompassed Christmas 1968 and the army cooks did their best to provide a suitable meal on the day.









Rest and Recreation (R & R) was valued by the soldiers and they often had a choice of destination.

Bill chose Sydney, flying out of Saigon on a Pan Am B707, followed by a flight to Melbourne with TAA (his former employer) to see his fiancé, Elva. It was a quick trip lasting a total of five days – including flying time – and he was back out on patrol the day after arriving back at his unit.

Bill completed a 12-month, 15-day tour from April 1967 to April 1968 including 10 days each way on the ship. During this tour, 7 RAR lost 16 soldiers killed in action while another 124 were wounded.

After arriving home on the Sydney, the troops were given train tickets to continue their travel. However, Bill's ticket was made out to Broadmeadow NSW (near Newcastle), not Broadmeadows VIC. Some quick footwork saw that corrected and he was soon enjoying a long-awaited




reunion.

Despite some difficult times, Bill thoroughly enjoyed his Vietnam experience, although several subsequent battles with the Department of Veteran's Affairs have not been quite as memorable.


