### **MOONEE VALLEY ART SHOW 2024**

Regina and Christine gave us an update on our major club fundraiser, the Moonee Valley Art Show. The show will be held at the Ukrainian Centre, 3-11 Russell St, Essendon 3040. It is adjacent to the Essendon Railway Station. The Gala Opening Night will be on Friday 11<sup>th</sup> October 2024 and the show open to the public on Saturday 12<sup>th</sup> and Sunday 13<sup>th</sup> October 2024.

The biggest need at the moment is to secure sponsors for the show. It is an essential part of the success of the fundraiser to have sponsors to cover the costs of the art prizes.

The success of the Art Show is the responsibility of every single club member. Guest speakers Lisa & Stuart Wait and Robyn Angus from Rotary Ivanhoe who spoke to us about the Ruben and Cambodia projects.









It was at the Rotary World Convention that Lisa Wait and Robyn Angus first met Rotaractors from Siem Reap, Cambodia. These students had been awarded scholarships to study supported by Rotary Clubs.

The Cambodia Students rural Trust (NFP) select students based on their academic commitment and ability, by referral from their village leaders, be committed to the project and Rotary and come from low income families for whom this education would otherwise be unattainable. The trust aims to educate future leader via community led leadership progression. They need to lead and manage social enterprise projects while studying the Bachelor of Business. Students are provided with a monthly living allowance and their tuition fees are paid for up to approx. US3000 for one year.

The Rotary Club of Ivanhoe is now organising fundraising to support this project as well as provide 100 school desks, bicycles, trees, solar lights and WASH funding. They are also organising a 7-day trip to Cambodia to support this program and invite anyone who is interested to contact them. The trip will take place Sunday 19<sup>th</sup> January – Sunday 26<sup>th</sup> January 2025. For more information go to <u>https://directory.rawcs.com.au/39-2023-24</u>. Stuart then told us about his trip to Africa with his son. As part of the trip they visited the Ruben Centre and saw the medical waste incinerator that our club recently donated.

Stuart rather sheepishly explained that he thinks the people at Ruben thought he was from Rotary Essendon and were very keen to show their appreciation for our support.

One big impact that the incinerator is having on the Ruben Centre medical centre is the ability to promote to local communities and other organisations their ability to safely deal with toxic or medical waste and that these other groups can

for a fee utilise the incinerator for their own waste disposal. This now provides

an ongoing income source for the medical centre helping ensure the viability of their services in to the future as well as bringing closer their goal of being totally self-reliant.

Stuart said that the Ruben Centre is an amazing institution operating in the middle of extreme poverty and offers hope to the community. The staff and students were incredibly friendly and positive. He said that this centre proved what a difference to others one capable and determined individual can make to a lot of people as he referenced Brother Frank O'Shae who has given such a lot to the centre and to its success.
