Guest speaker this week; our very own, newly minted Rotarian of the year, Michael Cariss

This week our speaker was none other than our own past president Michael Cariss who regaled us with stories of his years as a Rotarian and President of the Rotary Club of Essendon.

Michael joined Rotary on 20 Feb 1983 being introduced to the club by Glenn Anders. Being inducted to the club would be the start of a lifelong involvement in the club with his gorgeous wife Gaye. In 1990-91 Michael was the president of the club. The most crucial part of that year was fundraising for a project that was co-ordinated over three presidents and three years – the renovation to the Royal District Nursing Service

property which was located on the corner of Mt Alexander Rd and Grice Cres, Essendon. The club had been integral in the erection of the original building and now that the premises was deemed inadequate for the work being done the club decided to undertake a big project of raising \$100,000.00 to do the renovation to bring it up to the standard required. Fundraising included the annual Footy Stall at the Royal Melbourne Show. The stall was way ahead of its time providing paraphernalia to excited footy fans who queued to buy a hat or scarf, toy or footy in their club colours. Now all of the merchandise is sold via clubs and companies but then it was a rarity to be able to purchase such items at a shop. It took a big roster to fulfil the store duties and many hours of work but always bought in a good profit to the club. Other



fundraisers included trivia nights, Melbourne Cup sweep, William Angliss dinners, bowls with Rotaractors, Christmas hamper raffle and a tennis day at member Peter Condos' house. Exchange students went overseas and others were hosted by the club here in Essendon. Clean up days along the Maribyrnong, mock job interviews with St Columbus students and a visit to the Essendon Hospital – which is now the aged care facility in Holmes Road, Moonee Ponds, also filled in a very busy year. Guest speakers included Frank Evans who informed the members of the needs of the RDNS once the funds were raised, ABC's John Reid who ran a Poet's Corner event and Jill Keyte (mother of Jennifer Keyte of tv news fame) who was an exchange student of the club 20yrs earlier. This is not all! If you want to know more about what was achieved in that year you need to check out our own history book "Pick of the Bunch" which details the clubs 83 yeas of service when it was written in 2018.

Michael also told us stories of many of the wonderful experiences he and Gaye have had over the years. They have travelled widely, one to the US in particular was eventful, and have made many friends along the way. Both have valued their time in the club and have been active participants since joining. Without people like Michael and Gaye the club would not have achieved what it has over the years.

Without Michael we would not have the many laughs as he loves telling stories and jokes.


Thankyou Michael – and Gaye – for your contribution to the Rotary Club of Essendon, and for being wonderful friends to all.
