Attending the Rotary Youth Leadership Award in Axedale was in Ella's own words, "a lifechanging experience." Ella displayed excellent presentation skills in her talk to us about her time at RYLA. Led by Rotarians and RYLA alumni Ella participated in a series of activities that challenged her, developed her team building and problem-solving skills and helped her to become better at communicating and being in a position of leadership. Her confidence blossomed and she credits being a participant with improving the way she tackled studies at Melbourne University.

The RYLA programme is a world-wide Rotary programme designed within clubs and districts to suit their local participants. RYLA has been in Victoria for at least 40+ yrs as our own Editor participated as a much younger person. In District 9800 it aims to;

- Help participants gain a better understanding of their own strengths, passions and values
- Develop the leadership skills of young people through experiential workshops, involving teamwork, communication, motivation and introspection
- Foster an appreciation of the diverse abilities and unique qualities of those around them
- Provide an opportunity for young people to come together in a supportive environment
- Develop a set of resources and tools to facilitate the participants' ongoing development in their communities
- Create a greater awareness of social issues affecting young people
- Demonstrate Rotary's commitment to young people.

ROB FAVA ROTARY CLUB OF WERRIBEE

Who would have thought that within two years of setting up the Werribee Rotary Community Grants that \$38,300.00 would be donated to 15 organisations who needed vital items to run their programmes. Rob Fava did!

Rob's idea was to assist small local organisations who just needed those few extra dollars for, as Rob describes, the "nuts and bolts" basics to make their programmes operate better.

Why did Rob create the Community Grants?

He wanted to show Rotary's commitment to the local community, increase the ocal community, create hope in the community and recognise volunteers in the

profile of the club in the local community, create hope in the community and recognise volunteers in the community who run great programmes.

A big advantage to the club's aim to donate to local groups is that the organisations go to the club website to apply rather than the club needing to find groups themselves. In 2023 there were 24 applications for 6 grants awarded. In 2024 there were 45 applications and 9 grants awarded. Rob is hoping for 60+ applications this year to again award 9 grants. This shows the great exposure the club now has in the community.

The club has directly benefitted by inducting 4 new members directly because of the grants, they now have no problem getting volunteers to assist the club and have increased their social media exposure by thousands. Organisations go to the club website to apply for a one off \$2500.00 grant and have to comply with guidelines for applicants. The club raises funds for the grants via various fundraising efforts including monthly Community Bingo events and running an Op Shop. While a small club they are making a big impact.

CAROLINE CHISHOLM SOCIETY LOLOU KINI, CEO

The Rotary Club of Essendon has had a long association with the Caroline Chisholm Society.

From the days at the old house in Moonee Ponds where our members helped to erect shelters for donations and access ramps, to providing funds to build the current facility at 977 Mount Alexander Road, Essendon, from members generously donating many items of clothing, new or home knitted and also



donating their time for the sorting and packing of donated clothes, to others who donated toys, money and time to the Christmas Shop in Caroline Springs, the members of our club have been partnering with CCS to help vulnerable mothers, babies, children and families at their most difficult times for a very long time. This week we welcomed Lolou Kini, the current CEO of CCS, to update us on what and how the society is providing care to families. Lolou explained the mission of the society – to keeping families together (if safe to do so), to strengthen their impact, and to nurture and develop their people. They work on providing a "wraparound" model for their clients. The Society offers a dedicated case manager for each client, they have a specialist housing practitioner to assist with securing stable housing, a provisional psychologist provides perinatal mental health counselling so parents can develop skills and knowledge to become better parents, parenting support programmes in a variety of ways from one-on-one counselling to support groups and educational workshops and material aid for children 0-5yrs. That can include clothing, car seats, prams, toys, books and more.
