In the absence of President Maria the meeting was conducted by the Vice President Dr Peter Condos who welcomed Peter Duras's wife Sue.



Pat speaking in return stated that he joined Rotary in 1974 when he came to Melbourne from the country, he said that Rotary provided him with a lot of opportunities to meet people during his working life in Australia and overseas, he said he has visited Rotary clubs in many parts of the world.

Pat congratulated the Rotary club of Essendon for carrying on the good work in the community for so long and wished the members all the very best. He finished by saying that a lot of people enjoyed our club membership and he is now an active member of Probus.

**Peter Duras** 

The speaker for the day Peter Duras was welcomed by Dr Peter Baker, the theme of the talk was — "A funny thing happened on the way to the Olympics"

Peter Baker introducing Peter Duras said that Peter Duras graduated from Latrobe University with a B.App.Science in 1969, he worked for 2 years as a Physiotherapist at the Toronto General Hospital in Canada and returned to Australia in 1971 and started a private practice in Essendon with his wife Sue who is also a Physio.

Peter joined the APA and the Australian Sports Medicine Federation Victoria Branch and was appointed Physiotherapist to the Footscray Football Club. Peter travelled extensively overseas as Chairman of the APA and part of the Australian Track and Field in the 80's and 90's this included 4 World Championships, he was physio at 6 Commonwealth games.

Peter Duras has received the Australian Sports Medal and the Centenary Medal for his services to National and International athletes.

Peter's talk involved a power point presentation on the history of the Olympic Games, he said that the games started in ancient Athens in Greece and went on for 1200 years. He said the Greeks were intensely competitive and engaged in various forms of sports starting with running. The games then involved other sports such as boxing, pentathlon, running with armour, wrestling among others. His presentation showed the gloves that were worn by the boxers.

The games later involved Pankration and horse & chariot races. He related an incident when Emperor Nero took part in the Chariot race and won even though he fell many times and the other contestants let him win in fear of their lives! Peter said that all the spectators & participants had to come in the nude and no women were allowed even as spectators!!





Peter said that the Womens games called the Heraion games were started later and showed the uniforms the women participents wore which were not unlike the attire worn by the modern women athletes.

The Roman Christians who later ruled Greece banned the games and later a earth quake distroyed Olympia.

Peter further explained to the audience that William Penny Brooks started the modern Olympic games and Counbertin got the Olympics going.

Peter also spoke about Edwin Flack an Australian who took part in the early games and was known as the Lion of Athens and Donald Mackintosh who took part in shooting, in those day he had to shoot live pegions which no longer happens.

Then there was Freddie Lane a swimmer from Sydney who not only represented Australia but was aske by the UK team to join them and he became the first and only athlete to represent two countries at the same Olympic games!!

There was also George Eyser who won 6 medals and the first Aussie woman to compete in swimming, Fanny Durack who was advised not to go as she will be under the gaze of to many other men! and Clare Dennis who was criticised for showing too much shoulder.

Peter also spoke about the time Jessie Owens won gold and Jonny Weissmuller who competed in the 1924 Olympics and later acted as Tarzan.

Peter had so many interesting historical facts about the Olympics but had to cut short his presentation due to time constrains.


