

Speaker for the day – Person behind the badge – Jenni Mann



Jenny said that she grew up in a small rural town called Maitland in SA with a naïve country upbringing, she said she had 3 brothers and as kids they spent their spare time riding bikes, climbing trees and playing cricket in the street. The weekends & holidays were involved in going to the beach & camping holidays with the family.

She said that from what she knows her ancestry is British on both sides with Cornish ancestry on her Mum's side and Irish ancestry on her Dad's side.

Jenni said that she had some early experience of Rotary as her Dad was a member, she said her Dad was an Electrical Engineer who ran a Sales and Service Electrical business in town and across the district. She said her Rotary memories were of typing the Rotary Bulletin on Gestetner sheets for her Dad during high school years. She said that they had a Rotary exchange student from Japan when she was in year 11, her name was Toshika, and Jenni said she later travelled to Japan to visit and stay with Toshika.

She said after returning she was asked to speak at her Dad's Rotary club about her experience in Japan.

Jenni said she was a quiet kid while growing up and loved to paint and draw and her ambition at that time was to attend College and become an Art Teacher but there was a rare opportunity advertised for a position at the local bank and her Dad encourage her to apply as after she completed year 12 she did not have the desire to study further at

that time, she was offered the bank position and worked there for several years.

Jenni said that she married at the age of 22 and left home, some years later her then husband joined the services and they moved to NSW. In NSW Jenni said she obtained employment at a Chartered Accounting Firm and worked there until she had children. She said they had two children and subsequently moved to Melbourne in 1985 when the two boys were small, Chad was a toddler and Ryan a new born.

Jenni said they separated a year after arriving in Melbourne, she said it took another year to get her mind together after the separation and then had to make some hard decisions regarding herself and her sons.

It was then that she choose to undertake an Accounting degree which also gave her the opportunity to study from home and look after her young children, she said those were tough years raising two boys while studying full time and sometimes working casual jobs to support her family.

Jenni says that the difficult times provided some life lessons for the boys, after many years managing on very little she believes it instilled a good work ethic in them.

Jenni said that after she finished university and qualified she obtained employment at the Kangan TAFE and worked there for 11 years and at the same time studied further to obtain her CPA qualification.

Jenni said it was at Kangan that she met Peter 18 years ago who together with his two children make up the extended family of four kids. Jenni said that she later worked at the Dept of Treasury, The Environmental Protection Authority and now work at Victoria University.

She said that Pete & she like to travel each year and has done so for the past 10 years and there are a few more places they wish to visit.

Jenni said one of her goals in life is to stay healthy and without medication and to achieve this she says she visits the gym and have made a number of new friends at the gym. Jenni says she wants to spend less time in Accounting and wants to devote more time to her leisure pursuits such as painting, remaining healthy & travelling with Peter.

Jenni finished by saying that she feels very fortunate to have the love and support of Peter and good health and look forward to contributing to our community through Rotary.


