Senior Sergeant Ian Jones with President Maria & Rotary Sergeant Michael Cariss

Speaker for the day – Senior Sergeant Ian Jones OIC Moonee Ponds Police

Ian Jones was introduced by President Maria, she said that Ian grew up in Broadmeadows along with other famous Broadie Boys such as Eddie McGuire and his brother Frank as well as many others from the area who have gone on to do very well in business and in the community.

lan speaking to the group said that he joined the Victoria Police in 1977 and has been at Moonee Pond for the last 8 years and is now the Officer-in-charge. Ian said that the Moonee Valley area is similar to the City as it has most of the facilities that the Greater Melbourne City has in a smaller scale, and said that the Police Force is under manned as there is only one member per 1,500 people and he said at times it is very difficult to deal with all the daily matters. He said that they deal with at least 10 people a day and have over 1,000 incidents of family violence and had 5 road deaths in his little patch, he further said that there is a diverse demographic in this area and the stations are manned 24 hours and another 5,000 members would still not be enough, as such the Police are stretched to the limit he said. Ian stated that his biggest problem is that most of the officers under him are young and lack life experience and he is constantly trying to ensure that the young officers are acting in a balanced manner, but he said due to the work pressure they face on a daily basis it is at times difficult to contain the youth who at times think they can act in any manner because they have a uniform on.

He mentioned the statistics of home invasions which were 52 aggravated burglaries in an area with 45,000 homes, so he said that to a certain extent this is contained within reasonable limits even though the force is trying to reduce this even further.

He mentioned that the Police force is trying to bridge the gender inequality gap and in the process to achieve a 50/50 work force, he said that members of the force face danger every day and can call for back up if they feel there is a need. Ian said that the training period for new Police officers has been extended to 32 weeks now from 20 weeks in the past and they also have to work in a station to get experience before being posted to active duty.

#### Something to think about

"Psychology either makes or breaks you."-Tony Robbins, Author, "Unshakeable"

In most cases, Robbins says, our challenges are born from inaccurate recollections and false beliefs. Some of the biggest issues he sees among his clients are confirmation bias, recency bias and loss aversion. Here's how you can learn to overcome each.

- **Confirmation bias**, or a pattern in which individuals seek only information that will reaffirm what they already believe to be true, can be countered by asking challenging questions of yourself and others and seeking out informed individuals that disagree with you.
- **Recency bias** is the belief that current trends, good or bad, will continue. Robbins says the solution is to create a checklist of all the steps you're taking towards your goal and refer to it frequently. That will help you stay on track, whatever current conditions may be.
- **Loss aversion** is the tendency to recall negative experiences more readily than positive ones and to let those darker memories shape your expectations for the future. This can be overcome, Robbins says, by actively planning in advance for challenges and setbacks. These bumps in the road are inevitable and don't need to be feared.

By identifying the ways in which psychology can work against you, Robbins says, you can establish a healthier outlook. That makes executing a smart strategy far simpler.

"Psychology either makes or breaks you," Robbins writes, "so it's imperative to have a robust system that enables you to stay on target."


