Sergeant Michael spoke about the trip to Geelong where the Sri Lankan Council General in Melbourne was the guest speaker who spoke about the devastating tsunami and how Rotary helped the Island recover from the aftermath. He gave a detailed account of the destruction and how a school was built with the money collected.

He said a total amount donated by the Rotary Clubs of Australia amounted to \$600,000.

### The Speaker for the day

The speaker for the day was Stefan Romaniov - Chairman of Australia Day Council.

### Stefan Romaniw OAM

Mr Stefan Romaniw OAM currently holds the position of Executive Director of Community Languages Australia. He served terms as Chairperson of the Victorian Multicultural Commission. He has a teaching qualification and, prior to moving into senior government positions and senior management, worked in a range of school settings. He is Chairman of the Australia Day Committee (Victoria).

Currently he serves as Chairman or is in leadership role of a number of committees and organizations within broader

Australian and Ukrainian communities:

- Chair Australian Federation of Ukrainian Organisations;
- Chair, RMIT Languages Advisory Board;
- · Ukrainian World Congress (UWC) General Secretary

He currently is a member of the:

- Starlight Children's Foundation Victoria Advisory Board
- Victorian Ministerial Advisory Council on Multicultural Affairs (MACMA)
- Board member of the Association of Ukrainians in Victoria

He was a board member of Multicultural Arts Victoria for 15 years and was chairman for 10 years 2006-2016 and led the organisation to being one of the 10 lead Arts' agencies in Victoria



He has a successful career in brand building, change management, community building and strengthening, networking and strategic planning. He also has been a strong proponent of using spheres of influence as a strategy for building and influencing relations.

He has been a member on a range of Boards and committees including; Board of Council of Adult Education, Commonwealth Ministerial Standing Council on Immigration and Multicultural Affairs, National Accreditation Authority for Translators and Interpreters Board, Multicultural Issues Forum with Hume City Council; Victorian Ministerial Advisory Council Multicultural and Multilingual Education; Victorian Ministerial Arts Advisory Council; Centenary of Federation Victoria, the City of Melbourne Safe City Task Force, Good Food Advisory Board. He has been an Australia Day Ambassador in Victoria (Life Member) and has also fulfilled Australia Day Ambassador responsibilities in Tasmania.

He has a very wide based network through all levels of Government, education, media, sport the arts fields and NGOs.

In the Ukrainian Community he was principal of the Ukrainian Community School North Melbourne for 17 years, Chair of the Ukrainian School Council of Victoria, President of the Melbourne Branch and subsequently National Executive of the Ukrainian Youth Association and served as President of the Association of Ukrainians of Victoria for 10 years.

In 2001 he was awarded the Order of Australia Medal for his contribution to education and the CALD communities and in 2003 received the Centenary Medal for services to the community. He has received the three levels of Orders of Recognition and Medals from the President of Ukraine for services to Ukraine. He also received the Foreign Affairs of Ukraine medal for services to international relations.

In 2013 He was inducted into the St Bernard's College Hall of Fame.

He travels extensively internationally and nationally promoting his areas of expertise and has participated in delegations to China, Germany, USA, Canada, Hungary, Greece, Great Britain and Ukraine.

He holds membership with -

His interests include -Australian Rules Football, running, gardening and spending time with his family.

He has been married to Anastasia for 39 years. They have two married children Peter and Theresa and four grandchildren.

### Stefan spoke about the following matters:

- 1. Building a strong Australia
- 2. Australia Day Purpose Values, Commitment & Recognition
- 3. Diversity, its place role and responsibility
- 4. Building a stronger community
- Planning for the future Population policy, Build around strategy, plan for immigration, infrastructure, education, 5. social and economic reform
- 6. Ukraine situation Stefan explained the current situation in the Ukraine
- 7. Stefan also reminded all of the Rotary Moto "Service above self" and to use this to continue to serve the community.

Stefan said that the Rotary club of Holroyd in Sydney West raised funds by holding a function during the International Congress of Rotary in Sydney in 2015 at which himself and the John Hewko General Secretary Rotary International (who is of Ukrainian background) from the USA raised US\$5,000 and together with the Rotary Club of Germany and a Rotary Club in the USA led by Rotary Lviv bought several medical refrigerators for a proposed bone marrow transplant centre based in Western Ukraine.

Stefan spoke how his father a first generation migrant was involved in community work and how he involved himself in raising money staring in a small way to help the people in need in Tullamarine and was associated with the Essendon Football Club and new the previous coach Kevin Sheedy and how he mispronounced Kevin's surname.

Stefan said that people migrate to Australia for a better life and a fair go to all, as such there must be one society where everyone embraces the Australian way of life and abide by the rules of the country and at the same time be proud of ones heritage and be able to celebrate same as well. He said there are approximately 200 nationalities in Victoria alone and Australia is a very welcoming place and there should be one law for all Australians.

Stefan talking further about the situation in the Ukraine said they have been dominated for the last 300 years and independence was obtained from the USSR in 1991, he said a complicated war was going on in Ukraine affecting about 2% of the land. He said ANZAC day biscuits will be distributed to the soldiers in the front.


The group will then undertake a short holiday. Some of the highlights of the tour include:


