Shirley Swartz Nursing Scholarship <i>This scholarship is for one student entering the nursing program at any nursing college. This is a one year scholarship and can continue for a second year if all guidelines are met and funds are available.</i>	April 13, 2018	\$10,500
Mechanical/Electrical Engineering Scholarship <i>This scholarship is for one student entering the mechanical or electrical engineering field to any college. This is a one year scholarship.</i>	April 13, 2018	\$10,000
Norman P. Hetrick Scholarship <i>Three scholarships awarded annually to a graduating senior entering any degree program at an accredited post-secondary educational institution. This is a one year scholarship.</i>	April 13, 2018	\$5,000/Student
Act of Kindness Scholarship <i>This scholarship is for a graduating senior from Central Dauphin East or Central Dauphin High School student for any college. The student must have served two or more full years as a volunteer in the multiple disabilities classroom. This is a one year scholarship.</i>	April 13, 2018	\$1,000
Gary C. Clemens Scholarship <i>Awarded annually to one graduating senior from Central Dauphin High School. This scholarship is based upon academic performance, school involvement, community involvement, and an essay.</i>	April 13, 2018	\$1,000

Rotary Club of Colonial Park Scholarship

April 13, 2018

\$1,000/Student

Five scholarships awarded annually to one graduating senior from Central Dauphin High School, Central Dauphin East High School, Dauphin County Technical School, Bishop McDevitt High School and Harrisburg Christian School. This scholarship is based upon academic performance, school involvement, community involvement, and an essay. The Rotary Club of Colonial Park selects the scholarship recipients from an application process; applications are due in spring of the senior year.

Student of the Month Awards

Awarded to one senior from each of the following schools: Central Dauphin High School, Central Dauphin East High School, Dauphin County Technical School, Bishop McDevitt High School and Harrisburg Christian School. Awards are given at the Rotary Club of Colonial Park's luncheon eight times in an academic year. This award is based upon academic performance, school involvement, and community involvement; the recipients are chosen by the school guidance counselors.

RYLA Conference

Awarded annually to 10 junior students to attend the RYLA Conference (Rotary Youth Leadership Awards) held in June at Messiah College campus. The guidance counselors from Central Dauphin High School, Central Dauphin East High School, Dauphin County Technical School, Bishop McDevitt High School and Harrisburg Christian School select two students from each school to receive this scholarship. RYLA is an annual 5 day high energy residential leadership conference that is put on by the Rotary District 7390. Students will be challenged and encouraged by local top speakers in their field of leadership to be the best leaders they can be, beginning in their senior year of high school.

About 130 Junior's selected by 46 Rotary Clubs throughout South Central Pennsylvania will also attend this Conference. Expenses are paid by the students' local Rotary Club and include: tuition, meals, speakers, equipment and conference personnel.
