



2022 Rotary Grant Guidelines

Rotary is a global network of 1.4 million neighbors, friends, leaders, and problem-solvers who see a world where people unite and take action to create lasting change – across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves. Locally, the Rotary Club of York does this through **York Rotary Grants**. All interested applicants will complete a Letter of Interest (LOI) found on the Rotary website – www.yorkrotary.org The LOI will open on **March 15, 2022 and will close on April 15, 2022 at 5:00pm.**

York Rotary Grants

York Rotary Grants provide valuable funding support to address the changing needs of York through grant programs focused on improving our local community. Grants of \$2,500-\$15,000 will be awarded in 2022 that align local fields of interest with Rotary International's focus to take action on our world's most persistent issues. Each year, we choose two fields of interest to locally support with our funds.

Rotary fields of interest

- Education & Literacy (Supporting Education & Literacy)
- Infant & Maternal Health (Protecting Mothers & Children)
- Disease Prevention (Fighting Disease)
- Clean Water & Sanitation (Providing Clean Water & Sanitation)
- Environment (Stewarding the Environment)
- Economic Development (Growing Local Economies)
- Peace (Promoting Peace & Social Justice)

The fields of interest for 2022 and examples projects/programs that would fall under these fields follow. The Rotary Club grants committee only accepts letters of interest that fall under one or both of these interests.

Economic Development (Growing Local Economies)

- Programs and projects helping low-income families achieve lasting financial security, or promoting equal economic opportunities
- Events designed to draw people to a community and increase financial impact to the local economy
- Educational programs in job training or that help residents start their own local business.

Peace (Promoting Peace & Social Justice)

- Programs and projects designed to reduce community violence/crime
- Events to bring people together to promote peaceful dialogue and address community divides
- Educational programs promoting peaceful resolution to conflict
- Programs, projects and events to promote equal rights and equitable opportunities for all York residents

Eligibility

- Be a nonprofit, tax-exempt corporation, a unit of government, or school district located in and providing programming/services in York County, Pennsylvania. Applicants are required to provide proof of incorporation and activity in Pennsylvania before applications are reviewed or funds awarded.
- Unincorporated groups must apply through a nonprofit, tax exempt corporation that acts as a fiscal sponsor. The fiscal sponsor is legally responsible for the administration of the contract, including all reporting requirements,

and may charge a fee for its services. Applicants applying through a fiscal sponsor organization must meet the same requirements as other applicants, except for nonprofit status. The fiscal sponsor is responsible for any award. The fiscal sponsor receives the award check directly from the Rotary Club of York and is responsible for ensuring the completion of the final reports.

- Priority will be given to programs, projects and events that directly serve historically disadvantaged communities in York, including:
 - Black, Indigenous people of color (BIPOC)
 - Persons with disabilities
 - Children and adults that are housing insecure
 - Children and adults below the poverty line
 - Older adults over 55+ that are on a fixed income
 - Lesbian, Gay, Bisexual and Transgender Persons

Funding Restrictions

Grant funds cannot be used for any of the following:

- Activities outside of July 1, 2022-June 31, 2023.
- Activities that have a religious purpose.
- Payments to lobbyists.
- Cash prizes and awards.
- Benefit activities or fundraising events.

Grant Amount

Grants addressing one or both fields of interest that are selected to move to the full application stage can request \$2,500-\$15,000.

Application Review Process

- All interested applicants complete a Letter of Interest (LOI) found on the Rotary website – www.yorkrotary.org
- The LOI will open on **March 15, 2022, and close on April 15, 2022, at 5:00pm.**
- The Rotary Grants committee will meet and score all LOIs received throughout April, 2022. Committee members may reach out to LOI applicants to answer questions and provide an opportunity to provide more detail on the proposed project/program. The highest scoring LOIs will be invited to submit a full application on their project/program. All LOI applicants will receive notification of their status by **May 2, 2022.**
- Full applications will open **May 2 and will close on May 20, 2022 at 5:00pm.**
- Applicants will receive notification by **June 1, 2022.**
