


Bob and Deb as proud grandparents with Lily who graduated Summa Cum Laude Honors and a Degree in Biology

Whenever I meet Cher, her serenity reminds me of a quote by the Roman Poet Virgil in the

Aeneid, Being acquainted with suffering I am learning to help those who suffer (– a modern translation of Non ignaramali, miserissuccurrere disco.)

Yet in June of 2000, when Cher joined the Rotary Club of York East, none of the above would have ever been attached to her name, because Cher Kondor was, at that time, happy to be the mother of two teenagers, who were easy going, the kind of kids any parents would hope to have. Hence Cher and her husband Mike were able to concentrate on improving their little family's life. For Cher this meant trying her hand in utilizing her studies of Fine Art and Education in creating *Kondor Media*, by now a well-known and very successful company. Cher is mostly retired she spends two days a week at helping with appraisals and social media at JinJou's Gem Boutique, one of York's finest Jewelry Stores. This once again shows just how intimately interwoven the lives of the members of our club are.

On occasion, her company will produce industrial videos. Its services extend to advertising including Television, radio, social media, and print. Her company promises:

OUR MISSION IS TO ADVANCE CIVILIZATION THROUGH COMMUNICATION

...a promise that is kept in more ways than one.

Kondor Media seems capable of performing miracles when it comes to getting a message across, creating an emotional response to the facts that are conveyed, presenting their work in the most sophisticated style with that unique touch of depth and class.

Apart from the usual everyday trials and tribulations, life was so good that Mike and Cher were filled with gratitude. Both doting on their young and both being dedicated to improving the lives of those who are not as well off. Thanks to their philanthropic nature they shared whatever they could. That meant Cher was a Rotarian by nature even before she received the badge as a member of our club.

At that time Martin was 17 -and what a joy to have around



with the promise of a whole exciting life ahead of him.

For everyone who knows about Cher's loss, it is incomprehensible to imagine a mother walking into her dining room in late April 2004 looking into the eyes of two Army officers knowing within the next few seconds her life will be changed forever. Yet hoping against all hope to see if her son might be right behind them. "Casualty Officers always park in the neighbor's drive when they come to deliver the news that shatters your life because they don't want you to know before they can deliver the information", Cher remembers. And although from that moment on everything had become a blur, she still felt her heart beating faster than ever before, - and so loud that it drowned out every word these officers said. Everything began a slow spin around her, and it appeared as if she were watching a bad movie in slow motion.

All she could see was this photo she had just received from Martin in action under a deceptively peaceful crystal blue sky



Of course, Cher knew then that nothing would ever be the same again. She did not have to wait for the official statement to be read out to her and her husband Mike as they tried to hold on to each other, because by this time everything around them had faded.

The words "SPC Martin Kondor had been killed in action", did not even reach them. Mike and Cher's hearts were already broken into a thousand pieces.

Cher can barely remember the days, weeks, and months that followed, but whenever she watches the footage taken of her

walking through the chapel during Martin's memorial service, she sees a woman who seems like a stranger to her.

Not only did she change on that fateful day in April 2004, since then she has touched and changed uncountable lives by giving all those who have lost their loved ones a place to remember, to grieve, to cry, to pray, to seek solace, a place to be proud, and a place where they can feel close to those they have loved and lost

How does a family deal with the shattered dreams they had cherished while bringing up their sons? Afterall Mike's son Trevor, her 'ready-made bonus-son' had successfully completed his service in the 82nd Airborne in 1991.

Martin, Cher's first-born, and her second-born Joe, being so close in age, were inseparable, - the crowning of a romance that had started at Penn State's Middletown Campus. Cher was teaching a media class there while working full time in the news department at WHTM-TV 27 in Harrisburg. There in the front row was a totally bald young man, and his equally bald female friend. Knowing that baldness was not en vogue in the Pennsylvania of the late 70s, Cher was intrigued. She soon learned that those two friends weren't two crazies, showing off some ill-conceived desire to be different. No, they happened to be members of the cast playing their roles in a movie about the Holocaust with Vanessa Redgrave called "Playing for Time". This young man proved he had an impressive command of the English language and an innate talent for using media to convey a story. This young man whose baldness would soon give way to a full shock of black hair, interned with WHTM and was immediately hired in the news room. Their mutual respect and admiration grew, adding to his already remarkable attractions which she discovered with every passing day – simply by listening to those butterflies in her stomach. Needless to say, the same type of butterflies had invaded Mike's stomach, flapping just as madly.

And the rest is history, as they say, so on March 12th, 1983, they tied the knot. By that time Cher had long left her family home near Lewistown, where she, the second of three daughters, followed by two younger brothers, had enjoyed a happy, carefree childhood. She had graduated from Edinboro State College with a degree in Fine Arts only to pursue an additional Masters of Education in media at Indiana University of Pennsylvania. Within a year of Cher opening this new chapter in her life by becoming Mrs. Mike Kondor, Martin was born. "I was no spring chicken anymore, so starting a family was at the top of my list", she confesses.

In Mike, Cher had not only found her soul mate but the perfect man for all seasons. Being born into and brought up among the well-known Kondor Lumber business, Mike's genes ensured that, from a very early age, he knew how to fix things, - no matter what it was.

And luckily their two sons carried the same genes. Martin felt destined to be an engineer, already living out his passion for any type of engine by rebuilding or fixing motor bikes while he was still a teenager.

But that was not his only passion because he loved music, playing his guitar at a very early age. Many parents would sympathize with Mike and Cher when Martin announced his band was going to practice in the garage. And so, *THE GARAGE BAND* was born (with Martin in the middle).

Just like Mike's oldest son Trevor, Martin's younger brother Joe's genetically predestined passion for 'fixing things' is legendary. At Guardian CSE in Wrightsville, He fixes recirculating water systems in large companies like Johns Hopkins Hospital. The word is: If your hot tub is leaking, call Joe. If you want a classic motorcycle, call Joe. If you have any kind of technical problem, Joe is the friend you would ask to come around, knowing that he will know exactly what to do. And he found just the perfect wife with whom to present Cher and Mike with the one gift Martin never could: two lovely grandchildren. Their grandson Jaiden Martin – named in honor

of the uncle he never knew - is only 15 years old. But as a true Kondor, he already shows his heritage by being an expert welder, with just as much interest in anything that needs fixing as his granddad, dad and his uncle once did. The baby of the family, little Andrew Michael, is only 4 years old, giving his grandparents the chance to catch up with the babysitting skills they so crave.

Knowing Cher's love for children, it is not surprising that in the poignant speech she delivered on May 30th 2018 during a ceremony when Representative Gillespie dedicated a bridge on the portion of State Route 1008 crossing the Codorus Creek in East Manchester Township and Hellam Township in York County to honor Cher and Mike's son, naming it the *SPC Martin Wilson Kondor Memorial Bridge* that Cher reduced her audience to tears when she shared her sentiments: "Children are a gift, but they are also our best teachers just by being born. They teach patience, kindness, endurance, humility, and strength. And most of all they teach unconditional love. Children are the future and are to be cherished."

It was especially touching that the Eastern York H.S. Choir of Martin's school sang at this special ceremony of dedication, knowing that his former classmates and teachers are always finding new ways of honoring him.

The closing scene of the ceremony held at the Codorus Furnace on that gloriously sunny day would have made Martin smile from up there when his dad wrapped his arms around his mum, pulling her into an embrace so close, it looked as he would never want to let her go. And all the while the audience gave her a much-deserved standing ovation.

Cher describes Martin as a quiet, observant young boy, who loved to fish – and it is no coincidence that the bridge that now carries his name spans the part of the Codorus Creek where he loved to fish as a young boy. Despite his closeness to his younger brother, he saw his time at the creek as his own quiet haven. Many who saw him there all those years ago remember this young boy, holding his fishing rod, with great fondness but even more so with overwhelming sadness, only too aware that this is the place where Martin should be now, being in his late 30s, sharing his joy of fishingwith his own son.

But God had other plans and on 9/11, after watching the attacks on the Twin Towers in Eastern High School, when he returned home, Martin told his mother "We have been attacked on our sovereign soil and I am going to do something about it." Even before he graduated, he enlisted so that the moment he celebrated his 18thbirthday, just two months after the attack, he joined the Army. In 2002, after graduating, Martin Wilson Kondor went to Fort Knox to be an MIAI Tank Crewman, living in the Red Lion Barracks. He became a member of the Big Red One Alpha Company 1st Battalion 63rd Armored Division and was subsequently stationed at Vilseck in Germany. From there he volunteered for a Brigade Commander's personal security detachment to be deployed to Iraq during Operation Freedom 2. There he was assigned to 3rd Brigade Operation Base Combat Team at Forward Operating Base Camp Warhorse in Ba'Qubah, Iraq where he was named 'Soldier of the month'. His exemplary courage and his ability to make split-second decisions saved the lives of several of the entire PSD when they were attacked in a crossfire ambush. His was the only gun firing back as the RPG's flew so close you could read their serial numbers. This included exploding a fast-approaching car from the rear filled with explosives before it could hit their 3-car convoy.

This act of bravery, which earned him the *Bronze Star with "V" Device, denoting Valor and heroism in the line of duty*, took place on Good Friday, April 9th in 2004. How could Martin have known that he only had 20 days to live...

No words can describe the devastation his death has caused in his family and, indeed, among all those who knew him. But while Cher and Mike's unfathomable pain made them almost oblivious to 'the whole world' seemingly rallying around them, some unexpected solace came from Martin's comrades, who had been close to him during his final deployment.

One of the first to visit Martin's parents was his Commanding Officer, then General Dana Pittard, in command of Fort Bliss, Texas. His visit provided some comfort to both sides: to General Pittard as much as to Cher, Mike. Martin's Commanding Officer shared with them all those details they were craving for, up to a last-minute account of their son's life – and his death. Yet he could not express enough Martin's impressive bravery and the respect and gratitude he enjoyed from his comrades, especially those whose lives he had saved.

Martin's comrades dedicated the Martin Wilson Kondor Education Center in Ba'Qubah, Iraq.
In honor of their fallen friend and comrade



During his visit Cher and Mike gave General Pittard the glimpse of Martin's life he was looking for, taking him to Martin's grave, giving him a tour of the town where Martin grew up. He was deeply touched by the tree that had been planted by the teachers and students in Martin's honor at Kreutz Creek Elementary School

When he asked to visit their son's grave, they gave him some time alone. Yet when they saw from a distance that his Commanding Officer quietly saluted his fallen soldier who was also his friend, they couldn't hold back their tears.

To try and harness her grief Cher decided the only way forward was to share her experience with others who have lost their loved ones while continuing Martin's mission. When Martin's personal effects came back from Iraq, among them were notebooks where he was writing the core values over and over. Words such as courage, duty, and honor. Cher knew that he was trying to understand these core values and wanted to embody them as his PSD went about its mission of winning the hearts and minds of Iraqi Leaders. Cher found that translating these core values into living colors, plants in a garden, would allow people of any culture or any generation to be able to experience the core values to be the best they can be. The garden had to be

in a circle for unity. That is how America was born and how it will continue into the future.

And the Veterans Memorial Gold Star Healing and Peace Garden was born, a place to find peace and healing the ultimate reason behind wars. *Gold Star Healing and Peace Garden* names the Pennsylvanians fallen in the Global War on Terror. In addition, the first wall names the York County Fallen from the time of American Gold Star Mothers formation during WW1 until today. Yet this garden is not just unique to Pennsylvania or even to America. It is a place like no other in the world.

Here Cher's artistic talents, combined with Martin's desire of understanding the core values evolved into the Gold Star Garden. Along the middle walk in the garden, the Walk of the Intrepid, a series of garden rooms or beds represent the core values as follows:

RED COURAGE

ORANGE DUTY & SERVICE YELLOW REMEMBRANCE

GREEN HEALING

BLUE FIDELITY & LOYALTY

PURPLE VALOR

These 'rooms' with their meditative effect are all centered around an Honor fountain planted in white that symbolizes cleansing, joy, renewal, and the hope of ever-flowing life.

The GOLD STAR HEALING & PEACE GARDEN truly is synonymous for managing loss and grief, which it has done forhundreds of visitors during the past decade.

Cher is the first to point out that the garden belongs to the people. It came into being with the help of many hands: the dedicated board, the City of York providing the location and waiving many fees for its installation, many construction and landscaping companies, as well as countless volunteers. Donations came in to build the garden ranging from a nickel to grants of \$100,000. Stebbins and Company maintain the garden. It is a living memorial but will always need a guiding hand to keep it growing into the future. Jeff Hines and Patti Stirk hold an annual 5K fundraiser on Memorial Day. The garden also sells bricks, where bereaved families and friends can have the names of their loved ones memorized. This is another way to raise money for repairs and maintenance. Cher is grateful for them all, including the continued support of the Rotary Club of York East.

For the 10th anniversary on June 9th, 2022, Cher, through her company Kondor Media has produced a deeply moving half-hour documentary with the incomparable Ron Martin as Host and Narrator. Many of our own Rotarians, such as Cindy, Connie, Tim, JinJou, and Vicky are featured here, every one of them praising the garden and its unique merits, while trying to explain just how much it means to them all to be part of this special place.

"Some people come and walk around, reading the names, often taking imprints from the marble."

"You will often see someone sitting on one of those marble benches, quietly sobbing, consumed by seemingly immeasurable pain."

"Suddenly you hear the joyous sounds of children's laughter as they run around, spreading happiness around the garden, while their granny explains that this is the place where they can remember their daddy in heaven."

And once you watch the above documentary you actually feel that, as the camera gently takes you up-up and away into the sky right above the beautiful Honor Fountain at the center of the Gold Star, you are getting ever closer to those who are remembered here. The feeling is almost surreal, yet it is – for one brief moment – as if the dream of seeing your loved ones one more time has been granted. The magic of his garden is beyond words.

Right from the start, our club has supported Cher when her original idea first emerged, and as such this project is very much our club's 'own baby'. We all feel responsible for the annual cleanups, we all feel this is 'our garden'. And we are all proud to call the brave, the incredible, the amazing mother of Martin Kondor not only our own Fellow Rotarian but our friend.
