Use our hashtags: #MSRTrees – This will help us find all the posts easily! To add a hashtags to your post, simply type #MSRTrees #bartlettreeexperts into your post.

Tag the club's page – If you just type @morningstarrotary in your post, our page will come up - just will work. Or, start a post like normal, then click the blue icon - see below. A little text bar will come that says "Who are you with?" Click in it and start typing Morning Star Rotary and our page will come up.
