Program: Amy Rich Crane, MSOT OTR/L - Reach for the Top

Amy is the Executive Director of Reach for the Top N. H. Therapy Services, holds a B.S. in Speech Communication from SUNY and a MS in Occupational Therapy from Utica College in NY. She is a board certified pediatric occupational therapist and became the executive director in 2021 after serving as the organization's clinical director.

Reach for the Top Therapy Services works with families to provide individually tailored, holistic, respectful, and evidence-based occupational, physical, and speech therapies, in a supportive environment using fun and engaging activities to help children with exceptional needs thrive. The organization provides 18 therapy and specialty programs and served 490 children and families in 2023. They provided over 8,450 hours of therapy last year and currently have 265 children on a waiting list for services. Reach works with children and families in a variety of locations throughout Strafford county including horse farms, the Children's museum, the Dover Public Library and Snapology. They follow Harvard's Three Principles of Family Centered Care, support responsive relationships, strengthen core life skills and reduce sources of stress.

Amy reported the needs have never been greater with 1 in 4 children in need of sensory therapy, 1 in 10 children identified as ADHD, 1 in 36 children on the autism spectrum, 1 in 44 children with feeding dysfunction, 1 in 20 children with anxiety, and 1 of every 2 children having experienced trauma. Reach provides services to help meet these needs. Occupational therapy helps children regulate their bodies and provides tools to overcome challenges. Physical therapy helps children with fine and gross motor skills and works on such things as balance and coordination. Speech therapy focuses on communication,

articulation, language deficits and dysphasia. Reach has recently begun work with the Dover Children's Home on Trauma Informed care and collaborates with law enforcement, schools, the NH Dept of Children and Families, and the Child Advocacy Center.

Amy responded to questions regarding funding, volunteer opportunities, service area and discussed trends she is witnessing in children's services. She felt needs have increased since COVID and our society is more aware of issues regarding child abuse and neglect has contributed to growing needs.
