Portrait of a Learner evolved from earlier project. Inclusive process to develop – lots of interesting sessions with a wide variety of stakeholders (including presentation here at Rotary) – two years in development

Feedback results on what skills a learner needs to develop:

- Communication
- Collaboration
- Critical Thinking
- Character

Life Skills help us to safely navigate everyday situations and become more independent. They include things like managing time, staying organized, and being responsible, which empower us to accomplish tasks, set goals, and adapt to different environments with confidence.

Potential Partnership with Rotary – Visibility and Recognition Ceremonies

- Project will begin at Dover High: Rotary fund the printing of the posters,
- Rotary "Student of the Month" focused on Portrait of a Learner students who are exemplifying these qualities with a gift such as a key chain: Rotary fund the gifts. Currently recognition ceremonies are quarterly – idea is to add more ceremonies. Students who have been recognized would become the panel to select next students to be recognized.
- Total Request of Rotary: \$2,000

Questions:

- How is effectiveness measured? Measuring right now with students who are doing portfolios. For the community at large, this will come when the strategic plan has been adopted – shortly.
- There will be an oversight committee coming out of the strategic plan; *Portrait of a Learner* is the bedrock focus of the entire strategic plan.
- How does this improve basic skills? Right now academic skills are only measured by standardized tests. But those don't cover all that a learner needs.
- How will the club be involved in developing the recognition program? E.g. current student of the month program – how does the student demonstrate "service above self." We hope Rotarians will come to the ceremony, help in selecting students. We could be involved in which skill to focus and what the criteria might be.

Dr. Harbron: Lots of positive development coming as a result of SAU reorganization about two years ago; shuffling of staff for better outcomes.
