Past-president Megan K. welcomed all to Dover Rotary.

Megan noted April is Sexual Assault Awareness and Prevention Month (SAAPM), an annual observance dedicated to sexual assault awareness, prevention, and outreach efforts. One of the highlights of SAAPM is Denim Day, which serves as a visual reminder for us to always believe and support survivors of sexual assault. Denim Day began after a 1998 Italian Supreme Court overturned a rape conviction stating because the victim was wearing tight jeans, she must have helped the person who raped her remove her jeans, and thereby implied consent. The day after the ruling, the women of the Italian Parliament came to work wearing jeans in protest of the ruling and in solidarity with the survivor.

Program – Megan Keil: The Peace Corps and Rotary International Partnership

Megan spoke about her dual roles of serving as a member and past president of the Dover Rotary Club and recruiting for the Peace Corps in ME, NH and MA, highlighting similarities in mission and focus. Founded in 1961 during JFK's presidency, the Peace Corps (PC) works to foster world peace and friendship.

Megan's Peace Corps journey began when she was working as a zookeeper after receiving a degree in biology. A friend asked her to help with a PC application and she decided one day – "why don't I do this?" She volunteered in Tanzania, taught biology, in English, to students who grew up with hundreds of tribal languages. She added an extra year training volunteers on gender empowerment and developed a

partnership with local volunteers to supply feminine products to students so they could attend classes and taught them to say "no" when appropriate.

While not officially recruiting, Megan gave Rotarians glimpses of ways they could become PC volunteers. Regular volunteers serve 2 years in 59 locations around the world. The only age limit is 18 to begin and any age can join thereafter. Their oldest volunteer currently is 86. The PC also has a shorter 3 mo. program for a specific response/skill and a virtual volunteer program with a 3-6 mo. commitment.

Did she feel safe? Yes. PC does not work in communities if they are not wanted and she always felt safe. What can Rotary do for the Peace Corps? Encourage small partnerships, connect with Partnering for Peace, invite PC volunteers to speak, and, of course, volunteer.
