Program: Harry Cheney – Northeast President-Elect Training Seminar (NEPETS)

Dover Rotary's President-Elect Harry Cheney recently joined PEs from seven Rotary Districts in Newton, Mass, for the annual training seminar he described as an interesting, challenging, and fun event. RI President-Elect, Stephanie Urchick, set the stage announcing her goal of growing Rotary by 100,000 new members – primarily needed in the USA.

In turn, Harry discussed how Dover Rotary could increase membership, increase meeting attendance and do more for the community.

"I don't like meetings but I do like doing things," he said. "What can we change? Should we change meeting times to 4 or 5 in the afternoon? Have fewer meetings or not? Have a mixer? What works?

Suggestions were plentiful:

- Should we call members we haven't seen?
- Pay more attention to the people in the room than those not in the room?
- Should the club have a signature project like other clubs? (Westbrook has a pizza tasting event and Falmouth sells lobster rolls.)
- Have a community lunch/event "Garden Party" around the Garden planting in May? Invite food trucks. Focus on visibility.
- How do we get more interest in working Bingo?
- Should we do more classification talks, get to know each other?
