Program: Nancy Ryan, NH Breast Cancer Coalition

Bio: Nancy Ryan is a Founding member of the NH Breast Cancer Coalition (NHBCC) and volunteer NH Field Coordinator for the National Breast Cancer Coalition (NBCC). She was diagnosed with breast cancer in 1989 and with ovarian cancer in 1998. Nancy has served as a consumer reviewer for the DoD Breast Cancer Research Program and was a Consumer Participant and Scientific Session Co-Chair at five Era of Hope Meetings. She completed NBCC's science training course, Project LEAD, and served as a mentor. Nancy is married, enjoys exercise, gardening and caring for her cat, Maddy.

Nancy passed out copies pf the NBCC's "Breast Cancer Facts and Figures" handout and also the NBCC's Public Policy Platform. She explained her involvement with NBCC, since its 1991 inception in Chicago. A 34-year breast cancer survivor herself, Nancy said NBCC's mission is to raise awareness in the U.S. Congress of the need for research money. There are three pillars of action: *Research* which includes lobbying Congress for funds (\$150M annually of late) in the Department of Defense budget; *Access* which lobbies for healthcare for all, including covering screening and treatment costs; and *Influence* which includes leader trainings, seminars, an annual Leadership Summit in Wash., D.C., and the Project LEAD Institute in La Jolla, California.

Breast cancer is a political issue! Initially, Nancy was asked to collect 875 signatures for NH to join the Coalition; she collected 4,000 and graduated from her local support group to national political action.

Nancy also talked about recent breast and prostate cancer figures for NH. She speaks with politicians, many of whom visit NH during primary season, to ask them to sign the NBCC's Public Policy platform. Most recently, she spoke with Nikki Haley when the former S.C. Governor was in Dover. Haley declined to sign. Nancy will continue her advocacy efforts with each candidate who visits NH, hoping to gain support and to secure continued funding.

Q & A

Nick P.: Why the funds are in the DoD budget, not National Cancer Institute? Nancy: Initially some "leftover" money in the Defense budget was allotted to cancer research and has remained there. Jim V.: What is the mortality rate? How can it be reduced? Nancy: Science is showing that environmental factors may be keeping rates from slowing. NH has a high incidence rate (thanks to 37 early screening sites), but a low mortality rate. Jim and Nancy agreed that more outreach is necessary to get people to the screening locations for early detection.

Phil R.: What is the percentage of men with breast cancer? Nancy: In NH, approximately 2000 men will be diagnosed with breast cancer this year. As many as 530 deaths are predicted.
