The next item high on the list was the need for a signature event. What would such an event look like if we were in charge? Ideas included:

- Collaborate with another organization on an event, perhaps one they may already be doing.
- Create an event that invites everyone in the community to participate, not a fundraiser, a celebration kind of event
- The Salem Rotary Club used to provide support for the NH special Olympics
- Food truck event. Games for kids.
- Moultonborough Rotary Club holds a Chili cook-off event. Maybe we do international foods
- If fundraising make it for another organization, particularly smaller local nonprofits where \$1,000 or so would be of value
- Participate in Dover's Holiday parade
- Look for options that already exist that we can support.
- Think about location Rotary pavilion, park, good location for a signature event. There's little
 that happens in the early summer, mark the beginning of summer, like the South Berwick
 Strawberry Festival. Cook-out, BBQ Festival with fireworks perhaps?
- Duck race down the river?
- Outdoor activities must have a contingency for bad weather.
- Fireworks this year at Garrison Hill, starting in 2026 from Maglaras Park.
- Schedule event in consultation with Chamber and Rec Department review a yearly calendar
- 2026 opening of new Riverfront Park if we could grab a date for a signature event.
- Taking advantage of the river Cardboard Boat Race: Pumpkin Boat Race?
- Annual blood drive as we used to do.

Cate and Steve's purpose today was to get folks thinking. Please keep sharing ideas with them. A planning committee will be formed to narrow down the ideas and investigate.

Announcements:

Vote to approve supporting Dover Chamber events as a \$5,000 block grant rather than sponsoring each individual event as recommended by the BOD. This is a practical move that comes by request of the Chamber. **Motion to approve: Nick moves, Cindy seconds. Passed unanimously.**
