Programs #1 – Emily Fraser, 2020 Scholarship Winner



Accomplished, confident and excited – three of many ways to describe Dover High School graduate Emily Fraser - winner of Dover Rotary's \$10,000 DeColfmacker Scholarship. Emily is entering her senior year at Bently University majoring in Information Design and Corporate Communications with a minor in Finance. She carries a 3.8 GPA and has made Bently's President's List for the past 3 years. In her first year, she said she learned to never take anything for granted as the COVID epidemic closed classrooms, dining halls and most activities. All her classes were online.

During her sophomore year, life changed and many restrictions ended. As a former Interact student she took advantage of opportunities to serve and became a peer tutor, a Relay for Life participant, volunteered with Habitat for Humanity and joined Kappa Delta Sorority where she now serves as Director of Philanthropy and Community Service. She

also continued her 10 year commitment to compete in national jump rope competitions.

In the Fall 2022, she flew to Rome, Italy, to study and toured 7 other counties during the semester. Emily also managed to fit in 2 internships – one with TXS in merchandising and another in marketing

Program #2 - Richard Donhauser, South Berwick-Eliot Rotary Club - Solar Suitcases

Richard Donhauser described his club's project to light up the nights in rural African communities so

birth center's don't have to deliver babies by flashlight, eager students can study for exams without having to travel to a town center's for limited electric lights and life gets brighter for so many in the dark. The international project was funded with a district grant of \$4000 and additional funds raised by SBE club/community. They initially purchased 2 solar suitcases (created by WeShareSolar) at \$2,500 each and taught 160 sixth graders at Marshwood Middle School to assemble the components. "The kids gained solar literacy, and learned about direct current and alternating current in the process," Richard said. The work was done in science classes an hour at a time – took 10 classes to complete. A brief video demonstrated the process and highlighted the moment when each group's efforts resulted in lighting a light bulb or charging a phone. The



solar suitcases are donated to African communities and used to light solar panels—several can be chained together to light large spaces.

Program #3 - Harvey Bernier - Chapala Sunrise Rotary, Mexico



Harvey thanked Dover Rotary for our contribution to a global grant project to fund an education project in a poor Mexican barrio focused on reducing the high incidence of kidney disease. Due to changes in local agriculture into industrial development, farmers are no longer producing high quality food due to water pollution from industries that could not maintain US standards and move to Mexico. The result is poor nutrition, a higher level of diabetes and kidney disease. The local Rotary club has built a community center and now offers education to local women on how to cook more nutritiously. They have also brought in a world class chef to set up the kitchen and create healthy meals based on local culture.
