Program – District Governor Marion Cheney

Despite a rocky start, Marion Chaney said she is addicted to Rotary, loves its mission, purpose and fellowship. Her Rotary journey began 34 years ago at a Roanoke VA Rotary Club where she had been invited to speak on two occasions in a smoke-filled room to the all-male membership. She said, "the only other woman in the space was the piano player Alice." After the a Supreme Court ruling and RI's 1989 constitution and bylaws changed to allow women members, Marion applied for membership in the Roanoke club and was rejected.

Turned down but not deterred, Marion pursued membership again after moving to Florida a year later and has now been a Rotarian for 33 years. She moved to NH, transferred her membership to the Portsmouth Rotary Club, then joined our Dover Rotary in 2006.

Her path to becoming District Governor five years ago began with another denial but as she said, "it all worked out just fine," since her term would have been during the COVID lockdown era. When she reapplied 3 years ago, she was welcomed into the role and began an series of regional and international trainings/meetings where she met amazing Rotarians from around the world working together on this year's theme to *Create Hope Around the World*.

Marion, and her husband Harry, attended the International Assembly in Orlando earlier this year for intense training with 550 other DGEs. Their goals are to Empower Women & Children, support the Foundation/Polio Plus and Peace (a new Peace Center will open in Istanbul in 2025).

Supporting a Rotary Action Group Mental Health initiative was one of the focuses discussed at the Australia Rotary Convention and one of Marion's goals – looking for ambassadors for this project from each district club. After attending the funeral of a Brunswick club member, on behalf of the district, she was overwhelmed at the crowds giving their respects when she discovered the deceased had committed suicide and was only 32 years old – a young family man with a bright smile in all the photos on display at the service. Marion wants everyone to ask friends and family not "How are you doing?" but "How are you really doing."

At the International Assembly, Marion met a Rotarian from Poland who noticed NH on her ID badge. "I know people in NH," he said. The people he knew were from the Common Man and the Plymouth Rotary Club who have raised over \$2.1 M to fund trips to Poland to support Ukrainian families displaced by Russians. Their current efforts are focused on sheltering children from Russian traffickers. Another trip to support this effort is being planned for next April.

Membership will be one of the themes at the **2024 District Conference scheduled for June 23, 2023** at the Isles of Shoals. The Thomas Leighton will transport attendees to the event, leaving Portsmouth at 7:20 am and return from the Shoals at 3:45 pm.

Improve attendance at district events: **District Training Apr. 20, 2024** the **Peace Conference on Feb. 17, 2024** at Noble High School – a 900 seat venue that will be open to the public as well and one way to get the word out about the good works of Rotary.
