Program: Program: Amy's Treat, Nick Pellman, presenter



All types of Cancer, All kinds of Need... because while cancer is not unique, those who battle it are.

Amy's Treat was created in 2011 in loving memory of Amy Maliszewski who died at the age of 47 in 2007; it was her idea to give cancer victims a treat.

Nick, a Dover Rotarian for 20 years, described his first experience with Amy's Treat (AT) when he was receiving a 6-week program of radiation and chemo therapy for oral cancer at the Seacoast Cancer Center. By the end of 4th week of treatment he was falling apart and feeling miserable. About the 5th week, he got a gift of a Celtics game and night in Boston from Amy's Treat - something he will never forget. He has since joined the AT's Board and is an active advocate for the 100% volunteer, non profit group.

Nick noted AT receives no funding from the hospital and provides direct, on the spot, gifts or treats and need-based gifts. They raise funds from donations throughout the year including the *Amy in Bloom Auction*, a silent & live auction in the Spring and a Fall pub crawl. This Year's Auction will be held at the AC Hotel in Portsmouth, May 17, 2 pm – Rotarians are welcome as guests at the event

Amy's Elves is a special program to provide high impact holiday gifts, almost always to folks who have not asked for help. In addition to treats, the board acts quickly to

fund special needs such as transportation, car repairs, medical devices, funding for heating oil and gift cards. They also hold fun group events – e.g. Boston Flower Show trip with transportation and meals included and group visits to the Portsmouth Summer Prescott Park events.
