Program: Al Johnson: Children & Diabetes

Rochester Rotarian, Past President and former Dover Rotarian Al Johnson presented an enlightening and, at times emotional, overview of Type 1 diabetes from the perspective of a dad. His daughter Kim was diagnosed in 1997, with Type 1 diabetes, also known as juvenile diabetes or insulin-dependent diabetes, after a sports physical. At the time Al and his wife knew very little about the disease but eventually discovered how challenging and devasting the disease can be.

Al described his daughter as a "champion with the diagnosis" who was a great kid, attended RYLA, and went off to college. She managed well during her freshman year but stopped taking insulin in her sophomore year because it was a cumbersome process and she lost weight when she stopped it. Her health began to deteriorate and she had to drop out of school. She went to Joslin in Boston to treat multiple problems including foot neuropathy and the loss of most of her eyesight. Eventually she lost all of her eyesight and could not read her monitor (now available with sound). Her life improved when she had an insulin pump installed and was able to live "normally." In 2012 her kidneys failed and her mother-in-law became a donor. Kim

became an advocate for Children With Diabetes and attended their annual conference in Disney World in 2014 where she made friends for life, a group she called her "tribe."

Al described his daughter as "extremely happy" and "supper Kim" until one day in June 2019 her heart stopped. No one in the family was prepared for her sudden death. "It changed our lives forever," he said.

Al and his family and friends chose to remember Kim by raising awareness about the disease through community talks and raising funds to send other children with diabetes to the Children with Diabetes

annual event at Disney World. Last year's event hosted families from 47 states and 7 countries and hundreds of "friends for life." So far they have raised over \$25,000. It costs about \$3,500 to send one child to the event and about \$5,000 for a family – includes travel, accommodations, food and registration. Any amount is welcome.
