Liz Goldman is a 30 year resident of Dover, now retired from a career as an education and social science researcher and writer. Regarding challenges members noted homelessness and substance abuse issues, high taxes, lack of affordable housing and transportation and the need for stronger/skilled leadership. Looking forward to 2035 members hoped to see the completion of the waterfront development project, a place for the homeless, expanded mental health and other health services, and more affordable housing.
