Poland Trip: Gregg will be one of 6 Rotarians journeying to Poland on April 19, 2024, to explore ways to support their Ukraine projects focused on children and mental health.

Student of the Month: The next presentation will be at the Dover Middle School on Wed. Jan. 24 at 10:30 am.

Kids Closet: Supplies and gift cards have been distributed and the schools will let us know when more are needed.

Community Mental Health: Our club is a sponsor of Reset Day at DHS – giving kids an opportunity to get out of their regular classes and participate in activities focused on mental health.

Scholarship Committee: Norm H. will be sending applications to the local guidance counselors in 2-3 weeks. Seniors attending schools in Dover from Dover, Somersworth or Barrington are eligible to apply for 3- \$1,000 scholarships and the \$10,000 DeColfmacker Scholarship. More committee members are always welcome. Members will receive emails with the completed applications in late May followed by a virtual meeting to discuss and choose winners.

In addition to the scholarships, the club also supports a Dover Adult Learning Center scholarship and Vocational Training and Tools Grants.

!00 Year Celebration: Pres. Kathy noted the committee has chosen a gift wine glass for attendees and Noreen B. said the invitation design would focus on *Party Like It's 1924* – a Roaring Twenties theme. **Finance**: Nick P. reported our low risk invested funds (60% invested in bonds) are secure and fully liquid if the need arises to support a project.

Shoe & Boot: Nick noted the voucher system is working well and available through Dover schools, CAP and the Teen Center.

Foundation: Jim M. reported our club has donate \$335,000 since the Foundation began. Currently we have 29 Paul Harris Fellows, 2 major donors, 1 member of the Bequest Society and 4 members use direct deposit. So far this year 17 members have donated. Nancy B. praised the Rotary Foundation's recognition by Charity Navigator for providing the highest percent of funds directly to projects.

Homeless Project: Jim reported \$1,000 is still in the budget and available if needed to help someone "keep their head above water." Discuss with Jim. He also noted the District Grant Application is now online and easier to navigate.

Community Giving: Jay S. said his committee has 9 active members. So far this year they have awarded 71% of their budget to community projects and have \$3,000 left for the next 6 months, although he was sure if needed the BOD would expand their budget. He also noted many of the request are nearly double the amount of previous years.

Milk & Eggs: Cate R. said the program is running well with four locations CAP, Dover Food Pantry, Our Daily Bread Pantry and WDH's Women's Recovery Program. They distribute an average of 38 coupons per week.

Bingo: Cate R. reported the hall is averaging 100-105 players per week selling over 20 boxes of tickets. More help is always needed. The four clubs are also working well together. President Kathy said our

share of bingo is much less from prior years due to the 4-part program and the Board will discuss other options for fundraising if the need arises but not at this time. We will also continue to benefit from the Dover Poker Room fundraiser.
