



Jan. 24, 2024 – In-person & zoom meeting, 12:15
President Kathy F. welcomed all to the snowy January 24
meeting of the Dover Rotary Club. Nancy B. led members in the
Pledge of Allegiance, while Cathy B. led the recitation of the 4Way Test.

Program: : Nellie Young, Interact member at Marshwood (and daughter of AG Maryna Shuliakouskaya of the Kittery RC), who spoke about her upcoming Nursery School project in Peru.

Nellie's slide presentation was entitled "Investing in Hope: Transforming Kids' Lives in Peru". A student trip (14 Interact members plus chaperones; note: each trip is self-funded) is scheduled for February 16—February 27 of this year. The group seeks to assist in constructing and funding a new nursery space for 3—7-year-olds, plus improving water quality at the school in Pachacamac, Peru. They are seeking to raise \$12,000 (\$10,000 for construction, \$2,000 for school supplies).

Nellie explained the school's needs and why this project will greatly enhance cleanliness, water quality, and will improve classroom performance. The project works in two areas of Rotary focus: basic education/literacy and water sanitation and hygiene. The project also demonstrates sustainability by utilizing local resources for maintenance, requires continuing community involvement, and has Rotary Club oversight from the local club. She has raised nearly \$3,000 thus far but is asking for donations to help with the rest. Her GoFundMe address is

PayPal or Venmo (donors may be asked to enter this code: 4407 if using Venmo). RC of South Berwick/Eliot is their fiscal agent. Checks may also be sent to Nellie Young, 16 Maple Avenue, Eliot, ME 03903. They hope to raise the money and start the project before March as the school year runs March through December.
