Kevin is a Vietnam veteran having served in the US Air Force. He spent most of his career in sales and marketing working for a variety of companies including Mack Truck, R.J. Reynolds Tobacco and in the oil/gas industry. He has also run his own, a Boat Excursion business on the Cochecho River, after having obtained his Merchant Marine Captain's license. He has helped his wife run her Pinterest business selling quilts and other quality craft items and he currently owns NH Fundraising solutions helping nonprofits achieve success.

Kevin believes in helping others and providing service. His foundations included strong teaching in God, Country, and Family. He told several stories about his early years and the not-so-subtle guidance he often received from his mother and father. "Use common sense", and "Don't reinvent the wheel, improve upon it" were examples of things he was taught.

Kevin and his wife have faced many medical challenges over the years and continue to face them head on. His wife Patty had a medical event while driving and had a serious accident in downtown Dover. In the 90s she developed a brain tumor and Kevin has attended to her needs since including continuous hospital visits. Kevin also experienced several medical challenges including a heart attack in the early 90s and a recent stroke.

Through it all Kevin has remained active and involved in the community. He has served on the school board in Dover (while Jerry Daley was Superintendent) and the Dover City Council (with Tom Dunnington). He believes in giving back and consults nonprofits on fundraising. He believes Rotary is a great way to serve others and have a purpose in life and has already stepped forward to lead the Rotary Garden Committee.

Despite the weather, we a had great time and represented Dover Rotary well. We will plan another activity to distribute the children's books we were unable to pass out because of the wet day.
