Marion C. spoke with Wil's wife Barbara to express our club's sincere condolences - a memorial service will be held later.

### **Program: Club Assembly**

**Foundation:** Jim M. noted no Rotarian, to date, has opted out of the \$25 donation to the Foundation as part of the dues. He also thanked members for their generosity exceeding this year's Foundation goal of \$9,000, ending the year with \$11,000.

#### **Board of Directors:**

Budget: Gregg D. & Jim M. reviewed the BOD recommended 2021-22 budget (distributed to the membership) indicating a conservative approach to both revenue and expenses. The club will vote on the budget at next week's meeting. Jim M. emphasized the club's finances are in great shape and asked any member with ideas for great community projects to let him know.

**Financial:** Phil R. reviewed the Operating and Charities budgets reflecting increases in Bingo and investment revenue.

**Bingo:** Jerry D. stressed the need for more volunteers and explained plans for a 3,000 ft. addition to the hall (opening in July) to expand bingo seating and create space for new poker machines.

**Community Giving:** Jay S. said the committee reviewed five requests and sent one to the BOD due to the size of the request. Most requests are coming in close to the approval limit of \$1,500.

**Milk & Egg:** Cate R. noted the year's final donation is approximately \$1,200 above the original budget request but approved by the BOD. She said, "The demand continues to be high" and the program is being well used.

**Membership:** Marion C. is exploring a "Plus One" reduced fee membership option and asked members if interested - several raised their hands. More to come.

Marketing/PR: Noreen & Melissa mentioned recent news coverage regarding the golf tournament. Melissa also asked for help in her efforts to cover Rotary activities for our FB page, website and District Newsletter - looking for photos/stories. Betsey AP suggested Rotarians take advantage of the season coverage of the Chamber CAF Friday night series and have a Rotarian present at each event, beginning July 9. Rotary can also have a booth (trailer?) at the events.

International: Tom D. will be setting up monthly meetings.

**Senior visits:** Large plants with Rotary signage are being delivered - Riverside has one and Wentworth Home this week.

Community Gardens: Looking good.
