## **Program: The Traveling Tales Program**

Jackie Tromba is in her 27<sup>th</sup> year in teaching and started as a librarian in 1991. She has worked at the YMCA, Title 1, as a school teacher and literacy coach. Traveling Tales offers the opportunity for local children to check out books and learn right in their own neighborhoods.

In 1992, the Traveling Tales program formed, originally part of the Title I/Headstart Program, which is supported through federal funding. Once formed, this traveling van started to visit local Dover neighborhoods, reaching out to children and their families that may not have the opportunity to visit the local library. The program started in three neighborhoods and has since expanded into six neighborhoods.

With the traveling van, one can notice as they come into neighborhoods by the music it plays, similar to the ice cream truck. The van provides not only books, but snacks and additional literature on reading habits.

David D., Ron R. and Marion C. explained how the exterior and interior of this van needs a facelift and renovation. The van was parked outside for club members to tour. Several ideas were discussed about possible painting/wrapping of the current van, how the interior could be renovated and the exterior could display graphics linking the project to Dover Rotary.

We need volunteers to help complete the renovations. Dave D. passed around a sign-up sheet for Rotarians interested in some hands-on work. Van maintenance is provided by the City of Dover and staffing through the Title 1 program.

Some facts to know.

- This van holds anywhere from 1000-2000 books at one time for infants all the way to adult literature.
- The children love to take the books and have the responsibility to return them at the next van visit
- Books are given away at the end of the school year to keep the books fresh
