Program: Mandy Lancaster, Paul Staller, Waypoint Runaway and Homeless Youth Programs

Bios: Mandy Lancaster, Program Manager for Waypoint's Runaway and Homeless Youth Programs, has a myriad of professional experiences with families in crisis, youth in foster care and adjudicated youth, and women experiencing chronic homelessness. She has also worked as a street outreach worker, and a runaway and homeless youth social worker.

R unaway and Homeless Youth Program Manager Mandy Lancaster, highlighted Waypoint's outreach efforts in the Tri-City/Seacoast Region for youth ages 12-22 with a goal to "minimize the risk of exploiting young people and minimize the risk of young people experiencing chronic homelessness." They develop relationships that will build trust by providing shelter, food and connections with healthcare and mental health providers. When asked how the program builds trust, she said, "We're relentless ... we just take our time."

Imagine what it's like to be young, homeless, afraid, cold, lost and hungry. Paul Staller, Development Dir. at Waypoint, invited Rotarians to experience homelessness for one night - at Waypoint's **Sleep Out** on Mar. 26 at 8 p.m. The fundraising event will help support Waypoint's soon to open Drop-in Center for homeless youth in Rochester, serving the Seacoast region. The center will provide a pantry, shower, laundry facilities, a shuttle between Dover, Somersworth and Rochester and referrals for case management and therapeutic services.

Since that time, through mergers and restructuring the agency became the NH Children's Aid and Protection Services, Child and Family Services in 1967 and, in 2018, changed its name to Waypoint.
