Program: Molly Shanahan, Development and Communications Manager, Pope Memorial Humane Society-Cochecho Valley.

Molly has been with Pope Memorial for three years starting as Development Assistant and recently moving into her new role. She is a Dover resident for the past eight years and she and her boyfriend have a rescue dog and a cat of their own at home. She also welcomes fosters from the shelter into her home. Molly informed us that Pope Memorial has been in existence for 40 years serving the Dover community and beyond.

The shelter partners with 14 communities throughout Strafford County, NH, and York County, ME. Over 20% of the animals they serve come from Dover. Recently Deb Anthony became the Executive Director of Pope Memorial and the organization is changing to meet changing needs. Pre-Covid about 50% of the animals received came from communities with 50% referred by pet owners. Now, 95% come directly from communities and they currently serve approximately 100 animals, 40 of which are dogs. In response to rising needs, the Humane Society provides no-cost food assistance for pet owners, microchip clinics, low-cost spay and neuter clinics, and assistance with veterinary care. Molly reported that there are many reasons people must give up their pets and the assumption that they no longer care

is far from the truth. In many cases, they are heartbroken and have no other recourse. The Humane Society runs a variety of programs supporting their mission. They have many volunteers who provide services such as spending one-on-one time with animals, foster care, day trips for pets, kid's camps, and reading programs for kids in which they read to the animals. They also host birthday parties for children with animal interaction.

Rotarians asked questions regarding the types of animals served, breeds they most often have referred to for help, the fundraising activities they hold throughout the year, and upcoming events. They will hold a gala in May to celebrate 40 years and they plan a ribbon cutting for their new dog pavilion. Molly distributed an info sheet detailing the impressive accomplishments of the organization for the past year.
