Program: Northeast President-Elect Training Seminar (NEPETS)

President-elect Kathy F. noted over 400 Rotarians from six northeast districts attended the training event last week at the Marriot in Newton. During the weekend she attended small workshops and large presentations with the opportunity to sit at different tables and meet Rotarians from several states including Quebec. The RI President-elect R. Gordon McInally, Rotary Club of South Queensferry, Lothian, Scotland was one of the keynote speakers. "We were all trying to do good in the world and
