Mike** summarized the content of a proposal, approved by the board and distributed via email to the membership, to ask the Durham Rotary Club for two volunteer Rotarians to assist at the Dover Club's weekly bingo game. Members had several questions and comments about the possibility of finding more callers and even more volunteers from the Durham Club. The proposal calls for the Durham Club to provide for two volunteers for a period of six months. **Malcolm M.** suggested the need for a Memorandum of Understanding (MOU) between the two parties.

After a brief discussion about the terms of the MOU, **Pres. Mike** called for a vote to approve the proposal as presented, noting the board would be tasked with completing the wording of the MOU. The vote was unanimous in favor of the proposal.

Program: **Chi Jokonya, MD - Charity Work in Zimbabwe**

Continuing the legacy began by her father, a UN Ambassador, Dr. Chi spoke of her



work as a facilitator in the country of her birth. She founded the Jokonya Rural Development Trust to help the people of Chikomba, a remote town in Zimbabwe. She matches the needs for healthcare and better education with the resources in country and worldwide. Her efforts have helped establish three local clinics, train nurses, provide computers and software for students anxious to learn, and bicycles to help youngsters traverse the 5-6K distance to and from their classrooms.

Dr. Chi's niece visited Chikomba and returned to her home in Switzerland to raise \$40,000 by completing an 80K swim across Lake Geneva. Money raised by the trust supports the charities that do the work, provide the services needed by the families living in the rural community. Dr. Chi meets with local leaders and chiefs to assess the needs then contacts groups that can help such as World Vision and World Bicycle Relief.
