This will be dedicated to Gary Bannon for his 34 years of work for City's recreation department. (Shhh! Don't tell Gary...it's a secret!) There will be cake!

Milk & Egg---Cate reports that Our Daily Bread food pantry is no longer a pilot program but is now a regular part of the coupon distribution network.

International---Gregg D. reported on his Poland itinerary to Warsaw, Krakow, Zakopane, and Lublin and efforts to help Ukrainian children in Poland and a visit to a Recovery Home. Gregg also said that 7780 has 29 international projects, some new, some older, including the healthy kitchens, kidney disease education, and the kidney transplant projects led by Chapala Sunrise, Mexico (Harvey Bernier), the Bridgton Lakes aquaponics project in Colombia, the Saco Bay sunrise literacy project in Uganda, and a possible mental health project in Poland. Gregg mentioned that the International Café Zoom will be next held on April 6 if people want to learn more. Our own club's International Committee will meet via Zoom on Tuesday, April 2 at 7pm.
