President Harry called the meeting to order and welcomed all to the Rotary of Dover, NH.

Program: Kerry Folkins, Community Engagement Director for Granite United Way & Vicki Harris of Granite Youth Alliance

Kerry gave us a bit of information about Granite United Way. They cover 39 towns in NH and all funding comes through undesignated donations to the United Way (donations can be designated to a specific United Way beneficiary). United Way has changed their funding model and now disperses funds 3 times per year. In the last cycle they gave \$42k to 7 non-profits. Their focus is on tackling urgent needs. Granite United Way also runs NH's 211 program.

Vicki is with Granite Youth Alliance (and Dover PD) which receives funding from Granite United Way. They are a youth-led coalition that supports learning and healthy living with a focus on substance use prevention and mental health. Students are from 6th to 12th grade. The program was started 12 years ago and was based on Dover's evidence-based Youth-to -Youth program. They take a Knowledge/Skills/Action approach with the youth. There are 7 Action Teams which are student-led with adult support. The teams meet weekly after school. They plan and implement activities in 1 of 4 areas: Community Awareness, Education, Policy Change & Media. Each fall they hold a day-long conference which allows all of the action teams to work together. In the Spring they hold a film festival that features short films made by the students. This year's event will be held on June 2 @ Portsmouth Music Hall and is open to the
