Never pet a service dog; Never try to feed a service dog; Always be respectful and courteous; These are highly trained dogs, but like humans can still make mistakes.

Brendan spoke of his years with a service dog who unfortunately passed away after 14 years of service. He is awaiting another service dog to be provided by Canine Companions out of Massachusetts. Brendan explained that training a service dog takes over a year and then the dog and new owner must undergo additional training before placement. Brendan spoke of the help that his service dog provided every day as he interacted in his world. His dog could follow over 40 commands including accessing handicap door switches, finding clothes, and fetching personal items. He accompanied Brendan on his travels and even attended a Broadway play. Brendan reported that there are over 500,000 dogs providing service to individuals in the United States, but the number is illusive because service dogs do not need to be registered in every state. Some dogs are trained in centers, many of which are located on the west coast, and some dogs are trained by their owners.

Brendan started his nonprofit to assist individuals with service dogs because needs such as veterinarian bills and necessary medicines are not funded through any insurance programs even though service dogs are necessary for quality of life for many people. He spoke of several fundraisers he has planned as he seeks to help others.
