Program: Robert Siciliano, Security Expert and Private Investigator

Bio: Robert Siciliano is a security expert and private investigator with 30 years of experience, author of multiple books and training programs, frequent contributor on national media programs and CEO of Safer.me. His personal mission is to inform, educate, empower people to protect themselves and their families from violent crime.

In the first six months of 2020, 27 billion records were exposed, already many, many more that all of last year. 2004 – 2015, 10 billion records were exposed, getting exponentially worse. All our information is on file in many places. Example: 2005 TJ Maxx breach – this kind of thing is accelerating ever since.

Items to consider related to cyber security:

<u>Social Engineering</u> – confidence crimes (Con Man), attempting to gain your trust by gaining your confidence. Everyone of us is subject to falling victim – have to be careful and cautious every time there's a contact – phone, knock on door, devices, etc.

<u>Hardware</u> - Old hardware (PC, router, etc) does not have ability to run protective programs, e.g. Windows 7 no longer supported. Hardware should be updated, at a minimum, every 5 years.

<u>Software</u> - updates are equally important. Run a paid version of anti-virus – get more protection and is automatically updated.

<u>Secure wifi system</u> – must have a password to get in (e.g. encrypted)

<u>VPN</u> – a virtual private network. Use a VPN anytime you are using free wifi, e.g. at an airport. Easy to find and learn about with a simple VPN google.

Encryption – Do a search on Windows Encryption to learn how to do it.

<u>Tracking Software</u> – Should be installed, get from Google Play.

<u>Back-Ups</u> – both on local hard drives synched AND in the cloud. Should be checked at least once a month. A simple Google, get to PolarBackup.

<u>Passwords</u> – set up a password manager. Download and installed, cheap or free, automatically puts in your password.

<u>School Based Computer Program</u> – probably not much of a concern.

<u>Two-Factor Authentication</u> – should be used for all critical websites. Very easy to get instructions with a google search.

MSSPs or VCISOs – Business networks need this kind professional, periodic review.

Cyber Security Insurance – Businesses should have it.

There is no patch for human gullibility. There is a real need in a business for ongoing security risk training. For example, scam person emails employees that seem to be from the boss. For example, phishing training. Cybercrime soon to be the 3rd largest economy.
