President Kathy F. welcomed all to the Rotary Club of Dover, NH.

**New member induction:** Pres. Kathy welcomed new Paul Jenkins as the newest member, sponsored by Nick P. As a recent speaker, Paul said he was thrilled to become a part of Dover Rotary. He was this year's co-chair of the Seacoast Cancer 5K event.

### **Program: Darin Roark CEO WDH Mass General**

Darin Roark comes to WDH Mass General with 20 years of healthcare experience most recently in Clay County Florida were he built a hospital from the ground up in an underserved community. Roark holds a master of business administration

degree from Northern Illinois University, a bachelor of science in nursing from University of Wisconsin-Milwaukee and a bachelor of arts in business marketing from North Central College. He also serves as a fellow of the American College of Healthcare Executives .

Roark's mission is to "take great care of the community." One of the greatest challenges facing hospitals today, he noted, is the growing and aging population straining access to quality and timely healthcare. He often hears how difficult it is to get a doctor's appointment – he even had to wait a long time for a primary care visit. Cuts in Medicare and Medicaid and the struggle to recruit physicians and staff are exacerbating the situation – and he's working on it. The ER is under a lot of stress and he is working with a Boston team to come up with solutions such as Free Standing ERs. More to come.

Fortunately, he said, becoming part of Mass General has expanded and enhanced services for the Dover/Portsmouth community bringing a "world class teaching organization to provide world class care." He noted several award winning programs and services including oncology, neurology, electrophysiology, maternal and child care, and cardiology with specialty services in Dover and at Pease.
