## Program: Retired Colonel Greg Boyle

Col. Boyle joined us to speak about his involvement in the Semper Fi Fund and America's Fund. Established in 2004, the funds are in place to assist "post 9/11 veterans" in countless ways including:

- Relief from immediate and long term financial pressures so they can focus on their recovery.
- Home modifications to make daily living easier.
- Post Traumatic Stress support and programs that help save lives and families.
- Providing specialized equipment to help service members lead fulfilling lives.
- Veteran 2 Veteran program empowers service members by connecting veterans with one another to provide resources and transition into civilian life more successfully.
- Providing strength and support for caregivers.

Colonel Boyle also shared stories of two real life veterans with whom he has worked through the programs and the impact that is made in their lives is immeasurable.
