Program: Gary Bannon – Cocheco River Waterfront Park

Gary was with us to talk about the waterfront development and felt blessed to have the opportunity to speak to us.

Gary moved to the area from Rhode Island where he lived by the water and worked as a park manager. Being Dover's recreation director felt like a natural move for him.

Gary is now working on the waterfront park, a project that started about 20 years ago. The idea is to have the park be a place for water sports, with access for motor boats and a place where the community can gather and enjoy the outdoors. He believes that the water has a good quality because of all the movement of tide and rain water coming in. The plan is to start building from the water towards the land, and make the park an area with lots of green space, miles of trails, swings, benches, bathrooms and community gazebo.

Gary believes that creating this waterfront area will help raise the property's value in the area and overall be beneficial to the community.
