Special Presentation: President Noreen presented a \$15,000 check to Betsey A.P. for Community Action Partnership of Strafford County' Early Childhood Playground. The project is an initiative of the Dover Rotary and will provide a Nature Scape Learning playground at the new CAPSC site. Rotarians from Dover and Durham will

be involved in the playground installation as soon as the equipment has been received. Betsey expressed her appreciation on behalf of the children and pointed out that not only has Rotary made this possible, but the children continue to use Park Street Playground, another major project of the club. She also invited the members to join CAPSC for their annual Harvest Family Meals at the Head Start Program.

They are currently working with Durham Rotary to look for more connections and opportunities to serve. Their next project is Trick or Treat Canned Goods that will be collected on Halloween for End 68 hours of Hunger.

Sheila Rollins, District 7780 Rotaract chair is working with the club to schedule a trip to Puerto Rico to help victims of Hurricane Maria who are still struggling to recover from the losses and devastation caused by the storm. Each Club member will need about \$400.00 to be able to make the trip happen.

They are growing their membership and York Rotary has donated money to help buy give-away items college students might be interested in and hopefully become Rotaract members.

Currently the club has 15 members and is looking to expand. It was suggested that they approach our club for some help with their plans and activities.
