Paul Harris presentation: Marty Peak Helman was on hand, with great pleasure, to give out a Paul Harris +2 award to long-time member Kathy F. for her organization and leadership of last year's Peace Concert at Noble High. Marty called it the "best district event ever held"! The concert, with matches, netted \$32,000.

New member induction: Club secretary Marion C. led the induction of new member Bjorn Sigurdsson, who was warmly welcomed by members.

Marty was invited back to the podium to speak about the Rotary Peace Centers, specifically the newest one opening in 2025 in Istanbul, Turkey. (Marty is president of a small foundation, the Otto & Fran Walter Foundation, which donated \$15 million to this new Peace Center at Bachesehir University in Istanbul.) 20 Peace Scholars will begin master's or non-degreed certificate programs in January 2025 with the theme of "Positive Peace".

Another Rotary Peace Center, to be located somewhere in Asia, will be announced at the Istanbul opening (February 20-22, 2025) with plans to open in 2027. About 12% of the RI endowment (\$250 million) is dedicated to the Peace Centers. Tuition is free to scholars.

Marty also spoke, in her role as RF trustee, about Rotary emergency disaster relief funds which may become available for Asheville and surroundings if certain criteria are met. These include Rotarians on the ground, a natural disaster affecting at least 1 million people and causing over \$100 million in damages.

Announcements:

Bingo--- Cate R. reported our three club partners are very appreciative of working with our Dover club on Bingo. The revenue received has been instrumental is allowing these clubs to do more things in their communities. Turtle bonus is now over \$81,000. Volunteers still needed to count tickets Wednesdays and Thursdays from 2pm to 8pm at the Bingo Hall in Rochester. Cate urges members to contact her for instruction in how to use Sign Up Genius to register for Bingo shifts. Gregg D. reported \$51,640 in Bingo profits for July & August. (\$12,910 to each of the four RC, plus \$2000 off the top to Dover for administration.)

Polio Day is October 24. Harry C. announced we have \$1500 in budget allotted for this cause plus proceeds (TBD) from one night of Bingo profits, Dover club only; others will be asked to join us in this effort). Harry urges members to sign up for the Polio Plus Club.

Recovery Conference October 28 at Noble High School---Gregg D. reported that it was a great conference with fantastic speakers and over 100 in attendance.

Garden Clean-Up---scheduled for Saturday, October 19 at 8am. Gregg D. explained that we will dig up all perennials (6 varieties) to give away to the public. Annuals will be disposed of. The beds need to be completely cleared out so repairs to the rock walls can happen. Harry is getting quotes for rock and drainage repair and drainage.
