Program: Mike McGovern, Chair of Rotary's International Polio Plus

We had the honor of Mike McGovern of the South Portland/Cape Elizabeth Rotary Club to talk about partnering in our District and throughout the world in the fight to end Polio. He mentioned the last time that he had visited our club, a number of years ago, was when we were honoring Tommy Makem's wife with a Paul Harris recognition.

Recently, Mike traveled to Germany for the World Health Summit. At this summit, The Bill & Melinda Gates Foundation committed \$1.2 billion to support efforts to end all forms of polio in anticipation of World Polio Day on October 24th.

He talked about COVID and the impact that it has had on many of our members and clubs in being able to come together.

He compared the fight against Polio to a stepladder and how it has a big base that gets harder to climb as you go up. Rotary works hard to immunize kids and that it isn't until you get to the top and you realize the fight is not over until all of the cases are eradicated.

The vaccine has saved over 20 million lives. We cannot imagine the number of those contracting the disease or dying if there was

no vaccine. Fighting polio comes at a cost. Front-line workers earn \$5.00 a day to go door to door administering vaccines and have to go back after a few months again. The cost is about \$0.14 to buy the vaccine and almost \$2.00 to deliver. In total, about 291 million vaccinations

were administered. Rotary spends about \$88 million to fund this effort, yet not everyone is reached which is why there are outbursts in areas like Northern Nigeria, North Yemen, and Eastern part of Congo. Recent cases:

- 1. Polio in London environmental positive where injections are used and less than 50% of teenagers were vaccinated
- 2. Case in Jerusalem (Bethlehem)
- 3. Polio in New York 29 year old man in Rockland County

Mike is confident Polio will be eradicated soon. There would be over 350,000 cases if it wasn't for Rotary and the Gates Foundation. Mike thanked the Rotary Club of Dover for our support. He said, "Together we end Polio."

Questions:

- 1. How has what has happened in Ukraine affected the spread of polio? How about Haiti? In either country, most areas are not worried, only certain neighborhoods
- 2. Vaccine education in America?

Rotary believes in vaccines. It is the public and state individuals that push for them and it is mainly the Southern states that do not enforce or believe in being vaccinated and it is challenging
