HAVEN was founded in 1978. Their mission is to prevent sexual assault, domestic violence and stalking along with support to empower women, men, youth and families to heal from abuse and rebuild their lives. Through education, prevention, training, support services and community outreach their goal is to help end violence.

HAVEN is dedicated to addressing public health through violence prevention and improving the well-being of children and families. Goals include preventing sexual and physical abuse, sexual harassment, teen dating violence, and suicide.

The Safe Kids Strong Teens Prevention Program is presented in classrooms throughout Southeastern New Hampshire. Educators teach age appropriate, interactive, and research-based curricula.
